#1

Wear a helmet and wear it right!

Young or old, fast or slow, a helmet will protect your brain when you need it most. Wear it right: snug, level and low - and buckle up. Don't leave home without it!

#2

Be Predictable - Drive that Bike!

Don't keep everyone guessing your next move. Be predictable by following the rules of the road and act like the driver of a vehicle. You'll have fewer surprises, fewer conflicts, and a better experience.



#3

Be Visible! Brighter is Better!

Seek to be seen - as the smallest vehicle on the road, you want to make a BIG visual impact. That's why neon is favored by so many experienced riders. Bonus points for lights, reflectors, and reflective clothing (even in daylight!).
