BACKGROUND

At its regular meeting on January 13, 2015, the City Council received a presentation by Anderson Brulé Architects (ABA) regarding the Civic Center Master Plan update. At that time, ABA presented a review of the October 25, 2014 Design Charrette and a preferred core site design. Included in the core site design were various options for parking and placement of sport fields. Council provided direction to ABA to continue refining a preferred site layout, but requested additional information regarding parking needs and options since this is a key component in the final site layout and cost of future improvements.

DISCUSSION

As identified in the 2009 Civic Center Master Plan, the overall number of parking spaces needed for the entire Civic Center site is 565 (Attachment 1, page 2). Many of these spaces assume shared use of parking to reduce the total number of spaces needed. Based on Council direction related to the current Community Center project, these numbers have been updated to reflect parking recommendations for Phase I redevelopment. This updated number of spaces totals 540 (Attachment 1, page 3).

There are currently 343 parking spaces on the entire Civic Center site, 242 of which are located in the southeast quadrant, including the Library. Based upon the current existing need, this quadrant is short 31 spaces (Attachment 1, page 4). This figure does not include parking associated with a swim center since that does not currently exist on the site.

For all scenarios, parking was allocated to a specific site use based on its share of the overall need. For each use, the percentage of total need equals the percentage of parking allocated. For example, in the existing parking calculations, the existing Recreation use needs 134 spaces of 49% of all needed spaces. Currently 242 spaces are provided and therefore, Recreation is allocated 49% of those 242 spaces for a total of 119.

Based upon the uses included in Phase 1, 404 parking spaces are needed which includes parking for the Community Center, existing Library and History Museum, and the swim center. This number assumes shared parking for baseball, soccer and the existing theater. For comparison purposes, the chart below summarizes information regarding the proposed parking for each of the Community Center/field placement options (Attachment 1, pages 5-8).

Based upon the information provided in this report, Council direction is requested regarding:

- The number of parking spaces to be planned in Phase I redevelopment
- The preferred site layout
- If additional parking spaces beyond the number proposed in the preferred site layout are desired, identify type and location. Options for providing additional spaces include:
 - O Provide parking for the Library and History Museum in a later phase of redevelopment. The impact of this approach on the overall shortfall reduces the shortage in each option by 16 spaces. This is not recommended due to the unknown nature of future development and the need to provide parking for these activities.
 - o Maintain the existing parking shortfall of 31 spaces
 - o Identify additional opportunities for surface parking. Doing so would most likely result in additional spaces being located north of the Neutra House and south of the History Museum, causing a loss of open space in these areas.
 - o Include 100 additional parking spaces in underground/structured parking. 100 additional spaces in an underground garage would cost an additional \$6.38 million, while 100 additional spaces in an above-ground structure would cost \$3.19 million.
 - O Plan to provide additional parking in a later development of the northern portion of the Civic Center site. It is not certain when future development would occur and therefore, it is unknown how many spaces could be provided.

Next steps

Given Council direction on the site layout and parking variables, staff and ABA will move forward with finalizing the preferred site layout and associated cost model to present tentatively on March 24, 2015.

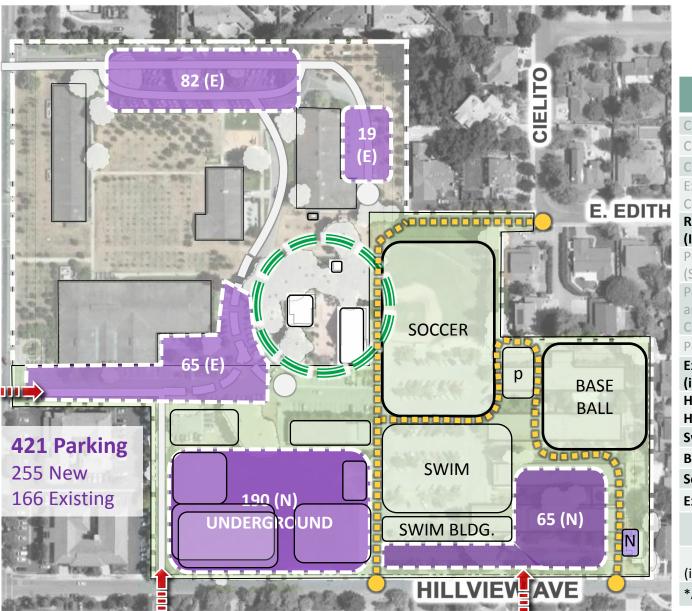

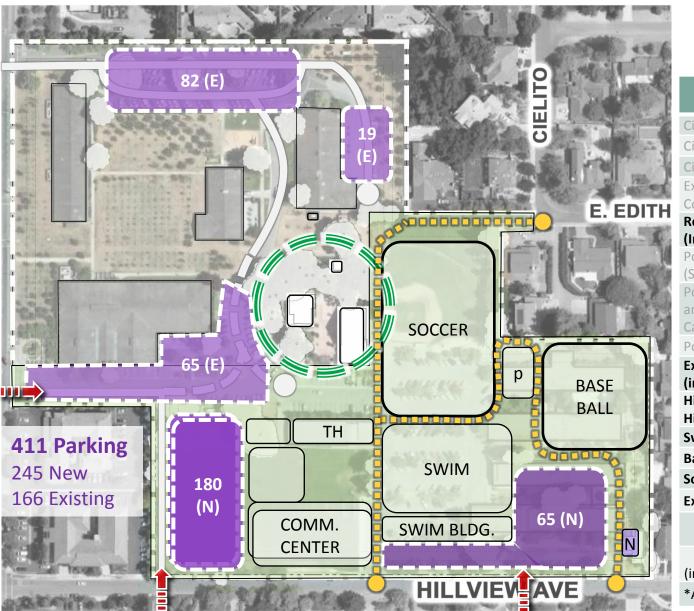

Site Concept - Field Location Option & Community Center Option & Parking Analysis



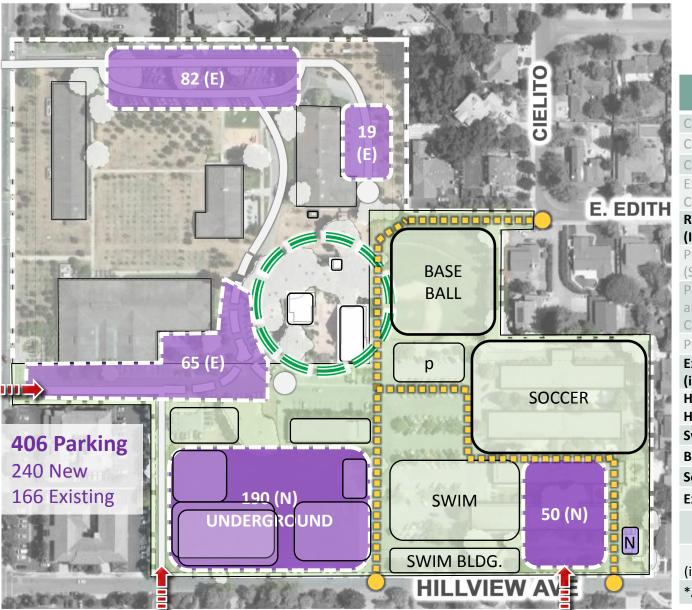

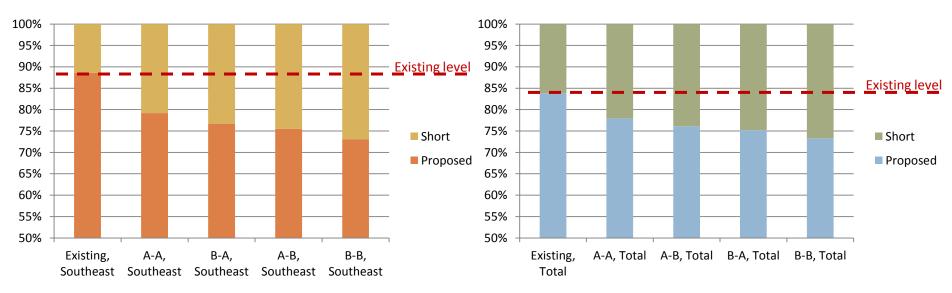

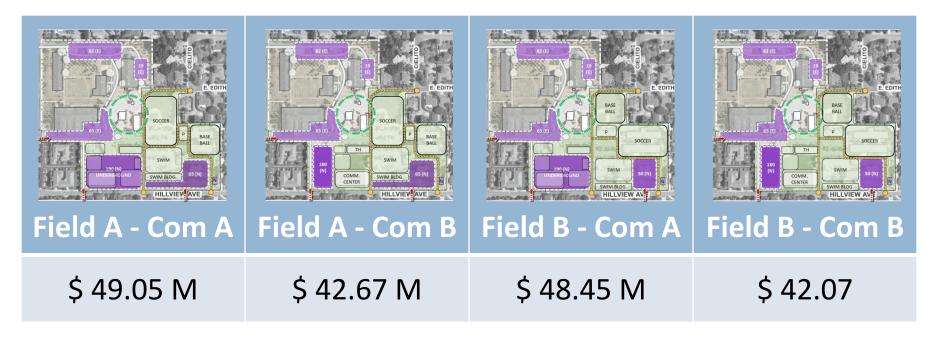


Southeast Quadrant
