Modification/Clarification to CIP

- Collector Street Traffic Calming
 - No neighborhood consensus on improvements
 - Recommend move to unfunded list
 - Re-allocate existing funds to School Route Improvements
- Illuminated Crosswalk Replacement
 - Current scope: replace 13 in-pavement lighted crosswalks with Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon Systems

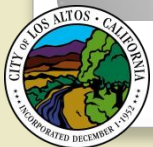
