**SUBJECT**:

Authorize acceptance of grant funding from the Santa Clara County Public Health Department in the amount of up to \$20,000 as part of the Partnership to Improve Community Health effort to be used for the purchase and installation of hydration stations in City parks

#### **BACKGROUND**

The City of Los Altos has been selected to receive funding from the Center for Disease Control and Prevention 'Partnership to Improve Community Health (PICH)' grant. This grant is being administered through the Santa Clara County Public Health Department and will provide up to \$20,000 to promote the purchase and consumption of healthy food and beverages by the public and City staff through the development of the City's healthy food and beverage guidelines and promotion of water as a healthy beverage choice.

#### **DISCUSSION**

The County of Santa Clara recently conducted a call for projects for developing healthy food and beverage practices for employees and the public. The program is designed to fund local agencies that have significant potential to promote healthy environments by increasing access to healthy food and beverages. The Recreation & Community Services Department has completed contract negotiations with the Santa Clara County Public Health Department and is working with Human Resources staff to develop an administrative policy that encourages consumption of healthy food and beverages.

The healthy food portion of the policy will require that at least half of food provided or sold by the City will be healthier food options. Snack foods provided or sold by the City will have fat, calorie, sugar and sodium restrictions in accordance with the Santa Clara County Public Health Department standards. Beverages provided or sold by the City will also reflect healthy standards and have restrictions on added sugar, with a focus on making water available.

The grant money to be received from the County will go towards the purchase and installation of hydration stations in City parks. At its January 13, 2016 meeting, the Parks and Recreation Commission approved a priority list and recommendation for drinking fountain replacements in City parks. The Commission also approved a recommendation to accept the PICH grant funding to use towards the purchase and installation of hydration stations in the parks. These hydration stations, also referred to as drinking fountains, will include dog bowls and bottle fillers. The first four parks on the recommended priority list are: 1) Marymeade, 2) McKenzie, 3) Montclaire, and 4) Grant.

#### **PUBLIC CONTACT**

The Parks and Recreation Commission considered the grant and potential locations for hydration stations at its January 13, 2016 and February 10, 2016 meetings.

Posting of the meeting agenda serves as notice to the general public.

#### FISCAL/RESOURCE IMPACT

The grant will increase available funds for drinking fountain replacement in City parks by \$20,000
