SUBJECT: RENAMING OF COMMUNITY PLAZA

This memo contains follow-up information regarding the proposal to rename Community Plaza to Veterans Plaza. Input regarding this topic was received from community members in several ways:

- 1. Open City Hall Survey
- 2. Nextdoor Survey
- 3. Email

A summary of all feedback received as of July 7, 2016 is included in this memo. Any feedback received subsequent to this date will be provided to the City Council prior to the start of the regular Council meeting scheduled for Tuesday, July 12, 2016.

Attachment A

Results from the Open City Hall Survey are attached as follows:

- 1. Survey results from registered users (n=54; 45% support renaming; 55% do not support)
- 2. Survey results for *unregistered users (n=87; 37% support renaming; 63% do not support)
- 3. Survey results with combined results of registered and unregistered users (n=141; 40% support renaming; 60% do not support)

*Open City Hall does not require users to register for the site in order to participate. However, only feedback submitted by registered users is viewable to the public. An unregistered user is someone who posts a statement without signing in, or someone who posts a statement signed in without verifying their email address or agreeing to the portal terms of use. The Open City Hall platform is savvy enough to prevent duplicate postings from registered and unregistered users.

Attachment B

Results from a poll the City posted on Nextdoor regarding this topic. The Nextdoor poll generated 86 responses. Results indicated 30% support for renaming Community Plaza; 53% do not support the renaming of Community Plaza; and 16% indicated indifference.

Attachment C

Emails from community members wishing to provide feedback on this topic were received from three sources:

- 1. Three community members responded to the City's News & Announcement email that was sent announcing the Open City Hall survey. Two respondents supported the renaming of Community Plaza, one did not.
- 2. One community member sent an email to the City via a website contact form to the Community Development Department. This individual indicated he supported the renaming of Community Plaza.
- 3. Forty-one individuals sent emails directly to me (Erica Ray) in support of the renaming of Community Plaza. These individuals were notified of the City Council's plans to discuss the renaming of Community Plaza by Ron Labetich, a Los Altos resident, business owner and Rotary Club member.

Note: There is overlap in the emails of support and Open City Hall survey results. The exact amount of overlap has not been calculated, however, some of the Open City Hall survey respondents provided names which match those in emails that were also sent.

Also, please note these surveys are not statistically valid, however, the information was collected in order to provide additional community input on this topic and assist the City Council in making a decision whether to rename Community Plaza or not.
