An Unprecedented Disaster Season



Tens of millions of people have been impacted by recent U.S.

hurricanes. Many saw their homes flooded, roofs blown off or windows shattered, and some lost it all—their homes were destroyed entirely.





Breaking Records



Harvey: Enough rainfall to fill the Great Salt Lake twice. Caused about \$100 billion in damage.

Irma: Cut electricity to one out of every 22 Americans. Damaged or destroyed over 195,000 homes in Florida alone.





Maria: Created the biggest humanitarian crisis in Puerto Rican history, destroying communications, electricity and water supplies for 3.5 million Americans.

In three months, from July through September, the **American Red Cross provided** more services nationally than we did in all of 2016!!

Our Local Contribution To The National Effort

- 154 volunteers deployed to the San Jose floods in February
- 55 volunteers deployed to hurricanes Harvey, Irma, and Maria
- 78 volunteers deployed to the Napa County and Sonoma County wildfires
- 8 volunteers deployed to the Ventura County and Santa Barbara County wildfires



Sound The Alarm – Our Major Preparedness Effort

- Nationally and locally, the American Red Cross is putting great effort into the installation of smoke alarms. <u>Home fires on a</u> <u>daily basis cause more damage and more fatalities than all</u> <u>other disasters combined.</u>
- In Santa Clara County we install smoke alarms in specific neighborhoods on a monthly basis in collaboration with local authorities and local fire departments.
- Sound The Alarm is a special effort, when during three dates we
 will install over 1000 smoke alarms. We need as much help as
 possible and would love to work with volunteers from your city.
