3. <u>COVID-19 Emergency: Preliminary Fiscal Impact and Financial Relief Programs</u>: Discuss potential COVID-19 financial relief programs and provide direction as needed

Administrative Services Director Etman presented the report on COVID-19 Financial Impact on the City of Los Altos.

Mayor Pepper recessed the meeting at 9:14 p.m. The meeting resumed at 9:22 p.m.

<u>Public Comment</u>: The following individuals provided public comment: Tom Myers, Esperanza McConn, Marsha Deslauriers, Pierre Bedard, Kim Mosley, Adin Miller, Scott Spielman and Ruth Darlene.

Action: Upon a motion by Councilmember Bruins, seconded by Councilmember Lee Eng, the Council unanimously adopted Resolution No. 2020-10 ratifying grants to WomenSV (\$40,000) and to Counseling and Mental Health Services of Mountain View (CHAC) (\$20,000) for assistance during the COVID-19 emergency, with direction that the funds come from the current Fiscal Year's unfunded balance.

Action: Upon a motion by Mayor Pepper, seconded by Vice Mayor Fligor, the Council unanimously adopted Resolution No. 2020-11 authorizing a grant of \$75,000 to Community Services Agency of Mountain View and Los Altos (CSA) for assistance during the COVID-19 emergency, with \$35,000 restricted to use for Los Altos residents and \$40,000 unrestricted.

<u>Action</u>: Motion made by Mayor Pepper, seconded by Vice Mayor Fligor, to adopt Resolution No. 2020-12 creating the Small Business Relief Program and authorizing \$250,000 for this program.

Vice Mayor Fligor offered an amendment, which was accepted, to allocate \$250,000 to the Small Business Relief Program and direct staff to work with the Chamber of Commerce and Los Altos Community Foundation on what the program will look like, including removing the first-come, first-served criteria.

The motion, as amended, passed unanimously.

City Manager Jordan presented the report on City emergency measures for addressing COVID-19.

- Address the requirement of paying pay sales tax to the City of Los Altos as it applies to those businesses that provide personal services and do not pay sales tax.

- Consider the grant differential between essential and non-essential businesses
- Clarify Chains versus franchise businesses

Further direction was given to proceed with opening the application period for a minimum of one week prior to closing the application period upon reaching or approaching funding in the amount of \$500,000 and to hold a virtual public lottery to award the grants.
