Dear Director Velasquez:

We write to convey our concerns with the timeline for the State to provide bulk allocations to the Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG) as part of the Regional Housing Needs Allocation (RHNA) process. We recognize that the Department of Housing and Community Development has recently delayed the release of the allocation from April to sometime this summer. However, the full impact of COVID-19 on State and local economies will likely not be fully identified until later this year. Any projections regarding growth should be paused until a clearer picture of the economy emerges.

The Department of Finance (DoF), which provides key demographic data to HCD, is understandably prioritizing the impact of unemployment and other effects on the State budget. We urge HCD, in conjunction with DoF, to consider a significantly later release of the RHNA allocations, so that projections of future population and jobs truly reflects the full impact on our local economies. If the current timeline proceeds, then the number should be reviewed next year and revised accordingly.
