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
- Staff have studied and reviewed the City's infrastructure needs

- During this meeting, staff is seeking Council's
 - Consensus on major infrastructure priorities
 - Ranking of the priorities (especially the top five)
- Staff would then develop or refine the
 - Budget-level cost estimates for each project
 - Respective budget impacts
 - Project schedules that accommodate the budget and Council priority list
 - Return to the Council at a later date with the above data so Council can refine and approve a final priority list


