2020 Plans

- Since the February 2020 report to Council... **Emergency Preparedness and Faith-based organizations**
- Partnerships with LAHCFD CERT and other Citic
 - Public educational programs
 - CERT Skill training
- Community & Emergency Preparedness Grants Program
 - Grant recipient selection under the new requirements
 - Added: CERT, AlertSCC requirements
 - Expanded to Small Businesses: emergency communications plan, NIXLE requirement
 - **Round 1:** 14 grants awarded on January 30
 - \$17K to fund projects like ham radio stations, emergency preparedness training events in neighborhoods, neighborhood supplies
 - Covering 918 households: 2 new BATs, 7 new applicants to the Grants Program
 - Round 2: applications due February 26
- Expand outreach and awareness efforts
 - Access & Functional Needs (AFN) emergency preparedness: Educational programs and training
 - School districts: outreach and partnering

COVID-19!



2020: the "Before Times"

- Los Altos Community & Emergency Preparedness Grants
 - City awarded 25 grants totally \$31K in January & February
 - Plans included neighborhood community projects, first aid/emergency kits, generator, Ham radio EIRS stations, etc.
- Amateur radio operators ("Ham") volunteers held drills:
 - Fun Run in January
 - County Ham drill in February
- At the start of 2020:

Block Action Team 25% of City covered by a BAT 101 BATs in Los Altos 241 trained BAT leaders

CERT Team: 75 registered as Disaster Service Worker Volunteers



Hams: 49 registered as Disaster Service Worker Volunteers



March: COVID-19 Public Health Emergency

- Emergency Coordinator, Police City Staff focused on COVID-19
- Emergency Operations Center (EOC) team: partial, virtual activation
 - City Manager, his staff, and emergency managers met regularly to assess the current situation and plan the response
 - City operations realigned for safety of community members and City staff
 - EOC deactivated in July
- Cancelled all in-person Community Emergency Preparedness events and activities
 - CERT training academy--cancelled
 - Any in-person training events, Inspiration Session, outreach—cancelled

 - Professional First Responders






Webinars for the community in 2020

- CERT Skills Refresh training webinar series
 - Partnership with Los Altos Hills County Fire District
 - Keep CERTs engaged, remind them of key CERT skills
- Santa Clara County Fire District planning 2021 CERT Skills Refresh webinars

BATs, CERTs and hams volunteers developed **refresh classes** on their Los Altos-specific procedures

- Preparedness and initial response for BATs, CERTs and hams
- PSA form training
- Packet radio for Los Altos hams
- BAT-CERT-HAM virtual drills

2020-2021 Los Altos BAT-CERT-HAM Workplan - virtual classes and drills

- Work teams are developing Zoom classes/drills
 - Preparedness and Initial Procedures for BATs, CERTs and Hams in Emergencies (two team dry runs completed)
 - PSA form training
 - PSA/EIRS training
 - LAARES packet training (team dry run and first class completed)
 - Virtual BAT-CERT-HAM drills
 - 90-min drill (two team dry runs completed)
 - 30-min flash drills (preparing for a dry run)
- 2021 delivering classes and drills, while maintaining ongoing program work

Faith-based Organizations (FBOs) Emergency Preparedness Group


- Meeting periodically to share best practices, learn about emergency preparedness, and plan
 - 2020: In-person in February; Videoconference in July and September
 - FBOs working to improve security at their campuses, mitigate active shooter risks, improve emergency preparedness planning as an FBO and among their congregants
- Email list to ask questions, share help and updates, etc.
- Recruited congregations across Los Altos and Los Altos Hills
 - 11 FBOs currently engaged in the group

 - Emergency preparedness "prompts" throughout each month






Household emergency preparedness and resilience and the Community Emergency Preparedness Volunteers are vital to our City

Los Altos employees begin their commutes in many corners of the Bay Area.

City employees (full-time)	Average commute
All	23.9 miles
City Hall	19 miles
Police Dept	28.8 miles
Municipal Services	26 miles

CERT – the Community Emergency Response Team **73** *in Jan 2021*

After event: will partner with BATs, check on their neighborhoods, and compile damage assessment/injury information. Might be directed to other duties in the City. <u>www.losaltosca.gov/cert</u>



Hams—amateur radio operators

49 Hams in Jan 2021

After event: will get on the air right away.

If needed, hams will run packet radio stations and report damage assessment data to City EOC Planning Section. Hams might be stationed in the EOC or directed to other duties in the City.

2020 CEP Volunteer Update

- **BAT** Program:
 - 25% of the City covered by a Block Action Team
 - LACF BAT work has been on hold since March 2020 due to Foundation COVID response; 2021 will deliver volunteer-developed online training to re-engage current BATs and help recruit and onboard new ones
- **CERT** Volunteers: 73
 - No new CERTs trained in 2020 (COVID)
 - COVID halted registering new DSW volunteers
- Amateur Radio volunteers (Hams): 49
 - Supported communications for the January Fun Run and November Festival of Lights parade float viewing while conducting ham drill
 - Los Altos ham-developed software now deployed across the county to improve packet radio communication
 - Built four new "Gen 2" packet stations; now operational with packet hams trained in a new Zoom class
 - Delivered Los Altos PREPARES-funded basic radio gear and vests for Hams

2020-21 Emergency Preparedness Objectives

- Increase numbers and coverage of Emergency Preparedness volunteers in Los Altos
 - Work to increase the Block Action Teams' (BATs)* coverage of City neighborhoods in support of City Council Priorities [Note: LACF manages the BAT program.]
- Increase engagement with Emergency Preparedness volunteers in Los Altos
- Build partnership with organizations in the City to recruit volunteers and educate on EP
 - Extend relationship with FBOs, Rotary, Kiwanis, American Legion, scouts and public schools
 - Build relationship with additional community groups
 - Continue outreach to business community on emergency preparedness
- Strengthen City of Los Altos EP infrastructure
 - Build and deploy group notification lists in Everbridge tool and business processes to maintain them
 - Drive visualization of volunteer damage reports and zone map in the EOC

*Block Action Team is a managed program of Los Altos Community Foundation in partnership with the City of Los Altos

2021 CEP Plans

- Offer training and information to CERTs, CEP volunteers and the community via virtual classes
- Support Santa Clara County Fire District's community education program and CERT skills refresh webinars
- Offer CERT skills refresh webinars with LAHCFD
- BATs, CERTs and hams volunteers will deploy the new Zoom classes on Los Altos procedures
- Continue work with the FBO EP working group
- Continue and expand engagement with the public school districts
- Community Emergency Preparedness Grants Program
 - Invite applications during Q1 2021
 - "Block grants" versus open-ended


