

City of Los Altos Status of Response to COVID-19 Emergency

JANUARY 26, 2021

County, Governor and Local Orders

- December 4: Santa Clara County issues order implementing State Stay Home order
- January 25: State lifts Bay Area Regional Stay Home order
- January 25: County announces some restrictions still in place
 - Ten-day quarantine following travel from more than 150 miles away
 - Hotels cannot provide lodging for non-essential purposes

What does that mean?

Outdoor dining may resume (indoor dining still prohibited)

Personal care services may resume

Retail still allowed at 20% capacity

City of Los Altos Emergency Response Status

- •All Facilities remain closed to the public
- •Playgrounds and restrooms are open, but gatherings are prohibited
- Construction projects and landscape maintenance are allowed
- Police and Maintenance services continue to operate as normal
- Building inspections continue with increased vigilance toward protecting staff and community
- •Staff that do not need to be in the office do not come in
- •Staff continues to monitor what services can continue to be safely provided to the public

City of Los Altos Emergency Response Status

- Staff in constant communication with business community
- Downtown parklets in place and ready to open
- Los Altos Restaurant to Go Week
 - Through January 31



Vaccine

- County currently in process of vaccinating Phase 1A
 - Includes health care workers and residents and employees of skilled nursing facilities
- County also vaccinating individuals 75+
- County goal is to finish vaccinating the community by August 1
 - Very far behind in reaching this goal
