

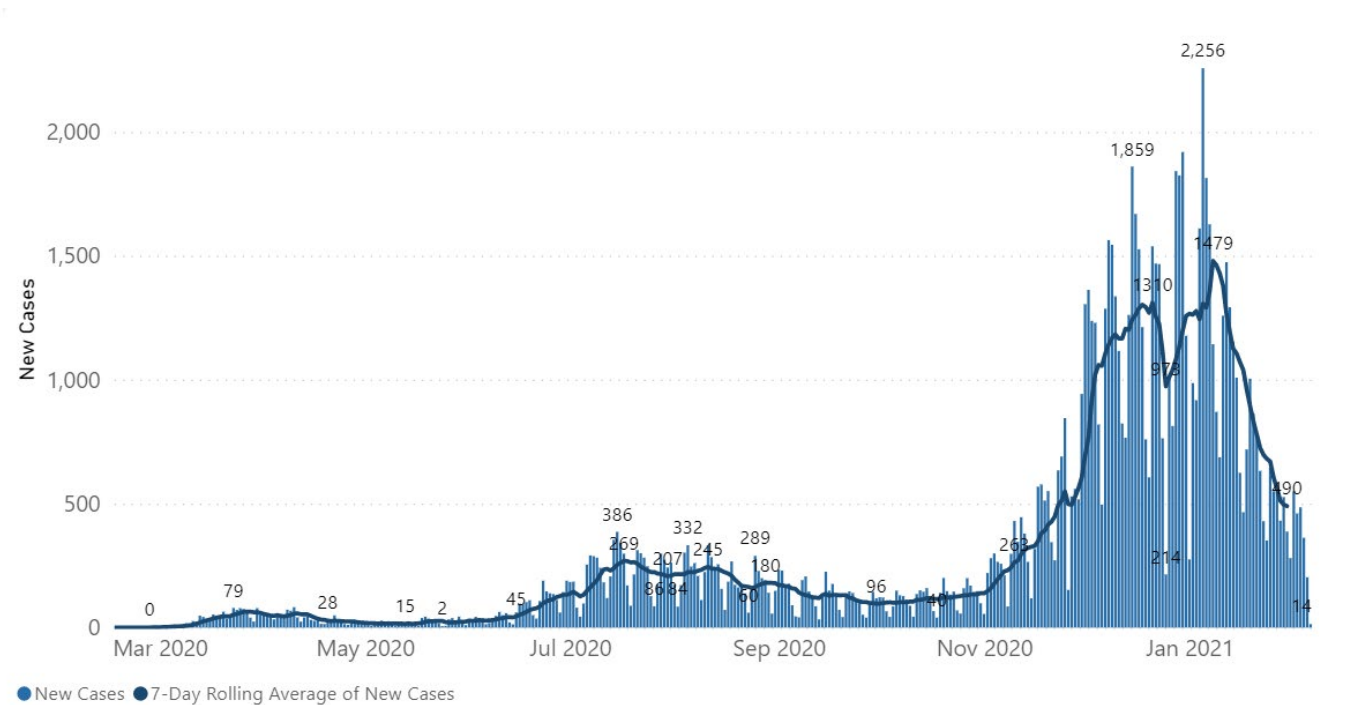


City of Los Altos Status of Response to COVID-19 Emergency

FEBRUARY 9, 2021

County, Governor and Local Orders

- January 25: State lifts Bay Area Regional Stay Home order – County restrictions still in place



City of Los Altos Emergency Response Status

- All Facilities remain closed to the public
- Playgrounds and restrooms are open, but gatherings are prohibited
- Construction projects and landscape maintenance are allowed
- Police and Maintenance services continue to operate as normal
- Building inspections continue with increased vigilance toward protecting staff and community
- Staff that do not need to be in the office do not come in
- Staff continues to monitor what services can continue to be safely provided to the public

Individuals' Response Status

1. Practice Social Distancing
2. Wear a mask
3. Avoid gatherings whenever possible
4. Follow CDC, State and County guidelines
5. When it's your turn, get vaccinated
6. Continue practicing 1-4 even after being vaccinated

Vaccine

- County currently in process of vaccinating Phase 1A and partial Phase 1B
 - Includes health care workers and residents and employees of skilled nursing facilities
 - All individuals 65+ (regardless of health insurance)
- County Vaccination Sites: County Fairgrounds (SJ), Berger Auditorium (SJ), Levi's Stadium (SC), Mountain View Community Center (201 S. Rengstorff, MV), Valley Health Center Gilroy, Valley Health Center Tully Road (SJ), Valley Specialty Center (SJ)
