Proclamation Of the Mayor Of the City of Los Htos, California

WHEREAS, the City of Los Altos is a community that celebrates its history, the rich past that is incorporated into the fabric of the City and provides a link to the community's heritage and the remaining sites and structures of architectural and/or historic significance that enhance the community's unique character and contribute to a sense of place; and

WHEREAS, the Los Altos Historic Preservation Award recognizes individuals, groups, organizations or projects that exemplify the spirit of historic preservation in the City of Los Altos; and

WHEREAS, on April 26, 2021, the Historical Commission voted unanimously to nominate **1365 Grant Road** as the 2021 recipient of the Los Altos Historic Preservation Award; and

WHEREAS, the homeowners of 1365 Grant Road have demonstrated a commitment to historic preservation by diligent compliance with the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Historic Preservation, which resulted in preservation of the 1913 Craftsman style house. The rehabilitation of the historic landmark structure retained the character-defining features of the west end of the house include the gable roof with projecting eaves with soffit boards, exposed purlins, rafters and eave boards; wood shingles with decorative profiles at windows, doors, and archways; brick sill course and river rock at the base; front-facing gable at Grant Road; and the entry porch facing both Grant Road and the rear south yard.

WHEREAS, 1365 Grant Road was designated by City Council Resolution No. 2017-03 a Historic Landmark on January 10, 2017 due to the 1913 Craftsman style house being more than 50 years in age, retains sufficient historic integrity, is historically significant, and has special historical, cultural, architectural and aesthetic value as part of the heritage and history of the City. The historic structures exhibit notable exterior architectural features and methods of construction, which represent high artistic values of the Craftsman style of the early 20th century with its character-defining features; and

NOW THEREFORE, I, Neysa Fligor, Mayor of the City of Los Altos, and on behalf of the entire Los Altos City Council, do hereby congratulate the homeowners of **1365 Grant road**, Daniil and Divya Reouk, on its award and recognize and commend the contribution of this project to historic preservation in our community.

Previous Council Consideration:

Fiscal Impact:

Increase plan check expenditures equate to more revenue to the City as all fees charged to the City by TRB +Associates are paid in advance by applicants submitting building permit applications and paying the required plan check fee. A portion of this plan check fee is retained by the City and the remainder is used to pay the charges by TRB + Associates.

Environmental Review:

This agreement amendment has been assessed in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (Cal. Pub. Res. Code, § 21000 et seq.) ("CEQA") and the State CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Code Regs. § 15000 et seq.) and is categorically exempt from CEQA under CEQA Guidelines, § 15061(b)(3), which exempts from CEQA any project where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment. Authorizing the Interim City Manager to sign an amendment to an existing agreement for building code plan check services will not be an activity with potential to cause significant adverse effect on the environment because it is related to the organizational or administrative activities of the City and will not result in direct or indirect physical changes in the environment, and therefore is exempt from CEQA.

• Shall the existing Agreement with TRB + Associates be amended so that expenditure limits in the Agreement meet actual plan check expenses.

Subject: Contract Amendment Approval

Summary:

Staff has found that expenditures for plan review services resulted in expenditures that exceeded the limits of the agreement with TRB + Associates for Fiscal Year 20 (FY-20) due to the higher than projected level of construction and permit activity in the City during that period. This agreement amendment request brings the authorized expenditure amount in line with the realized plan review costs. These plan review costs are fully funded by those applying for building permits and paying the plan check fee at the time the applications are submitted to the City.

Staff Recommendation:

Approve amendment number 2 to the Agreement between the City of Los Altos and TRB + Associates and authorize the Interim City Manager to sign the amendment to the agreement in an amount not to exceed 29,671.69, for a total agreement amount of \$979,671.69.

Purpose

This requested amendment brings the agreement in line with actual expenditures for FY-20.

Background

Since 2008, the Building Division has utilized outside building permit plan check services to evaluate the plans and documents submitted with construction permit applications. In 2016, the City entered into a three-year agreement with TRB+Associates for these outside plan check services. The term of the agreement was three years with expenditures expected at \$190,000 per year, for a total agreement amount of \$570,000. There was one amendment to the agreement approved by the City Council in 2019 for \$380,000 (\$950,000 total), which provided for an additional two years of plan check consulting services.

Discussion/Analysis

This amendment request corrects expenditures above the limit in the agreement for FY-20 and is the first of two requests being considered by the City Council at its May 25, 2021 meeting (second amendment request will provide funding for plan check services during the current fiscal year FY-21). The expenditure above the agreement limit was to cover the cost for the plan check services provided by TRB + Associates and is reflection of the permit activity the City was experiencing during FY-21.

An additional allocation of \$29,671.69 is being requested to cover these plan check services. All the expenditures for this agreement have been covered by the plan check fees paid by applicants when they submit a building permit application; therefore, the fees are collected prior to the City incurring any plan check costs. The City retains a portion of this plan check fee to cover the cost of administrative overhead and the other portion is used to pay for the outside plan check costs. Once the plan check is complete, a building permit fee is paid by the applicant at the time the building permit is issued.

Increase plan check expenditures equate to more revenue to the City as all fees charged to the City by TRB +Associates are paid in advance by applicants submitting building permit applications and paying the required plan check fee. A portion of this plan check fee is retained by the City and the remainder is used to pay the charges by TRB + Associates.

Environmental Review:

Subject: Contract Amendment Approval

Summary:

For Fiscal Year 21 (FY-21), expenditures for plan review services provided by TRB + Associates are expected to exceed the amounts authorized in the current agreement due to the high level of construction activity being experienced across Los Altos. This agreement amendment request brings the authorized expenditure amount in line with anticipated plan review cost for FY-21. These plan review costs are fully funded by those applying for building permits and paying the plan check fee at the time the applications are submitted to the City.

Staff Recommendation:

Approve Amendment No. 3 to the Agreement between the City of Los Altos and TRB + Associates and authorize the Interim City Manager to sign the amendment to the agreement in an amount not to exceed \$100,000 for a total agreement amount of \$1,079,671.69.

Purpose

This requested amendment brings the agreement in line with actual expenditures for FY-21.

Background

Since 2008, the Building Division has utilized outside building permit plan check services to evaluate the plans and documents submitted with construction permit applications. In 2016, the City entered into a three-year agreement with TRB+Associates for these outside plan check services. The term of the agreement was three years with expenditures expected at \$190,000 per year, for a total agreement amount of \$570,000. There was one amendment to the agreement approved by the City Council in 2019 for \$380,000, which provided for an additional two years of plan check consulting services.

Discussion/Analysis

This amendment request will cover anticipated plan review expenditures for FY-21 and is the second of two requests being considered by the City Council at its May 25, 2021 meeting (the first amendment request was to provide funding for plan check services during the FY-20). This expenditure amendment is a reflection of the permit activity the City is experiencing during FY-21.

An additional allocation of \$100,000 is being requested to cover anticipated plan check service costs. All the expenditures for this agreement will be covered by the plan check fees paid by applicants when they submit a building permit application; therefore, the fees are collected prior to the City incurring any plan check costs. The City retains a portion of this plan check fee to cover the cost of administrative overhead and the other portion is used to pay for the outside plan check costs. Once the plan check is complete, a building permit fee is paid by the applicant at the time the building permit is issued.

If approved by the City Council, the agreement amendment will be routed to the appropriate representatives, including the Interim City Manager and City Attorney, for signature.

Subject: Quarterly Investment Portfolio Report – Quarter Ended March 31, 2021

Purpose

These quarterly reports are presented to both the City Council and the Financial Commission to keep both bodies apprised as to the status of the City's investment holding and demonstrate compliance with the City's Investment Policy.

Background

A review of the Investment Portfolio Report Quarter Ended March 31,2021 was presented and discussed by the Financial Commission on May 17, 2021. The Financial Commission reviewed the Quarterly Investment Portfolio Report ending March 31, 2021 and had a brief discussion on the LAIF yield, which is currently at .339% (for the month of April 2021).

Discussion/Analysis

The summary provided below presents the sum of all City investment holdings. The City's portfolio book value, excluding operating cash, as of March 31, 2021, was \$53,937,022. The City's operating cash, as of March 31, 2021, was \$11,286,007.15.

As of March 31, 2021 22.8% of the City's portfolio was placed in Federal Agency Securities (Fannie Mae, Federal Home Loan Bank, Federal Home Loan Mortgage and Federal Farm Credit), 10.8% in Asset-Backed Securities, 1.6% in Supra-National Agency Bond, 40.2% in US Treasuries, and 15.5% in medium-term Corporate Notes and Commercial Paper, 7.2% in Certificate of Deposits, 0.2% in Money Markets, with the balance of 1.7% in LAIF. This portfolio mix is illustrated as part of Attachment 1.

Full compliance with the City's Investment Policy is monitored closely and on a per trade basis as illustrated in Attachment 2. In accordance with California Government Code 53646(b)(3), the City of Los Altos has the ability to meet its pool expenditure requirements for the next six months.

As part of these quarterly updates, a status report is prepared by PFM which is included as Attachment 3: Investment Performance Review for the Quarter Ended March 31, 2021. It is important to note that this report highlights the performance of City investments that fall outside its liquid holdings with LAIF. This has been intentionally crafted to isolate the performance of the City's independently managed investments. The total return of the portfolio since inception is 1.37%, which is highlighted on page 16 of the PFM Investment Performance Review Report (Attachment 3).







GDP Estimates Improve Due to Passage of New Relief Bill


U.S. Quarterly GDP Forecasts for 2021






U.S. Economic Momentum Accelerated in the First Quarter of 2021




High Frequency Data Indicates the Economic Recovery Is Gaining Momentum


U.S. Labor Market Beginning to Rebound Strongly



Fed Participants' Assessments of "Appropriate" Monetary Policy




Treasury Yield Curve Steepened on Economic Optimism


Agency and MBS Yield Spreads Tighten, but Corporates and ABS Widen




- Our strategy for the first quarter encompassed the following:
 - We maintained core allocations in most sectors while modestly reducing allocations to corporates due to unattractive yield spreads and increasing the allocation to U.S. Treasuries.
 - The federal agency sector offered record-low yield spreads, especially on maturities inside of five years. New issue supply was very light. The combination of light issuance and historically tight spreads led to no agency purchases during the quarter. In the government space, we preferred U.S. Treasuries.
 - Investment-grade corporates eked out muted excess returns as higher income offset modestly wider yield spreads.
 Supply was strong and rising rates put natural upward pressure on yields spreads. We continued our fourth quarter strategy of gradually reducing allocations, except for an occasional attractive new issue.
 - Allocations to asset-backed securities (ABS) declined modestly over the quarter as light new issuance at attractive levels
 did not offset normal paydowns. Like corporates, excess returns were positive but muted compared to the very strong
 performance of the prior few quarters.







Investment Strategy Outlook

- The vaccine rollout, accommodative monetary policy, and the new \$1.9 trillion of fiscal stimulus all point to continued improvement in U.S. economic fundamentals. GDP projections for 2021 have been revised up several times, with current forecasts pointing to growth of 6% or more this year. That optimism, however, has also translated into increased inflation expectations, particularly in the near term, which is likely to continue to put upward pressure on longer term rates.
- Our outlook for major investment-grade sectors includes the following:
 - Treasuries: Current allocations provide opportunities to move into other sectors should spreads widen.
 - Agencies: There is limited room for further spread tightening from current levels. With spreads likely to remain near zero
 over the coming quarter, the sector offers very little pickup compared to Treasuries. We will likely continue reducing
 allocations in favor of other opportunities.
 - Supranationals: Spreads compared to Treasuries and agencies have widened and now present a reasonable alternative
 to other government securities. New issues remain the best entry point, and we will look to adding supranationals, most
 likely funded from reduced allocations to federal agencies.
 - Corporates: Continued economic recovery, supportive monetary policy, lower expected supply, and strong global demand for U.S. credit will serve as support for the corporate sector. Credit spreads have widened from their extremely tight levels, providing some yield pickup, but spreads remain well below long-term averages. As a result, we will continue to be selective in seeking new additions to the sector.
 - Asset-Backed Securities (ABS): New issue activity has been elevated to start 2021; however, investor appetite remains robust and yield spreads remain near their recent floor. Collateral performance in consumer sectors has been stronger than expected and the strengthening of the economic expansion should continue to be a favorable tailwind. We will look to maintain holdings in the sector but will evaluate new issues to offset paydowns.
 - Agency MBS: The Fed continues "to support the smooth functioning" of the MBS market through its ongoing agency MBS purchase program. While prepayments have remained elevated, the coming quarters should commence a meaningful slowing trend. We will look to maintain MBS portfolio allocations as spreads continue to sit at historically narrow levels while continuing to avoid the low coupon structures most susceptible to duration extension.

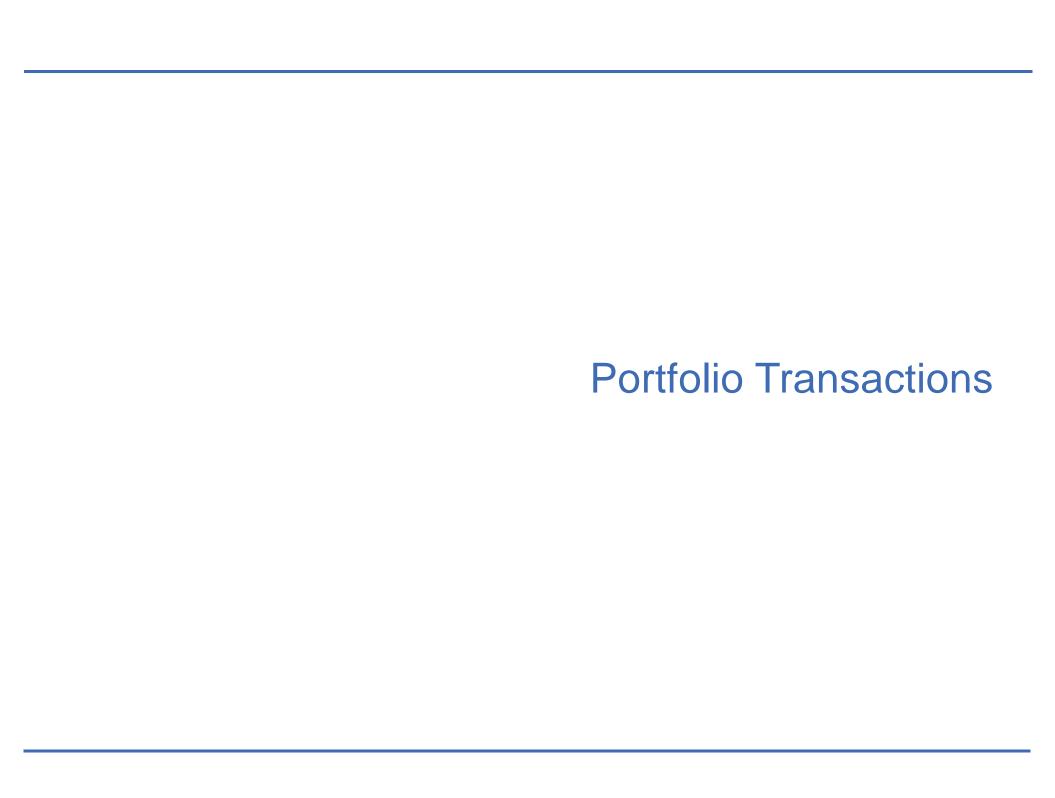

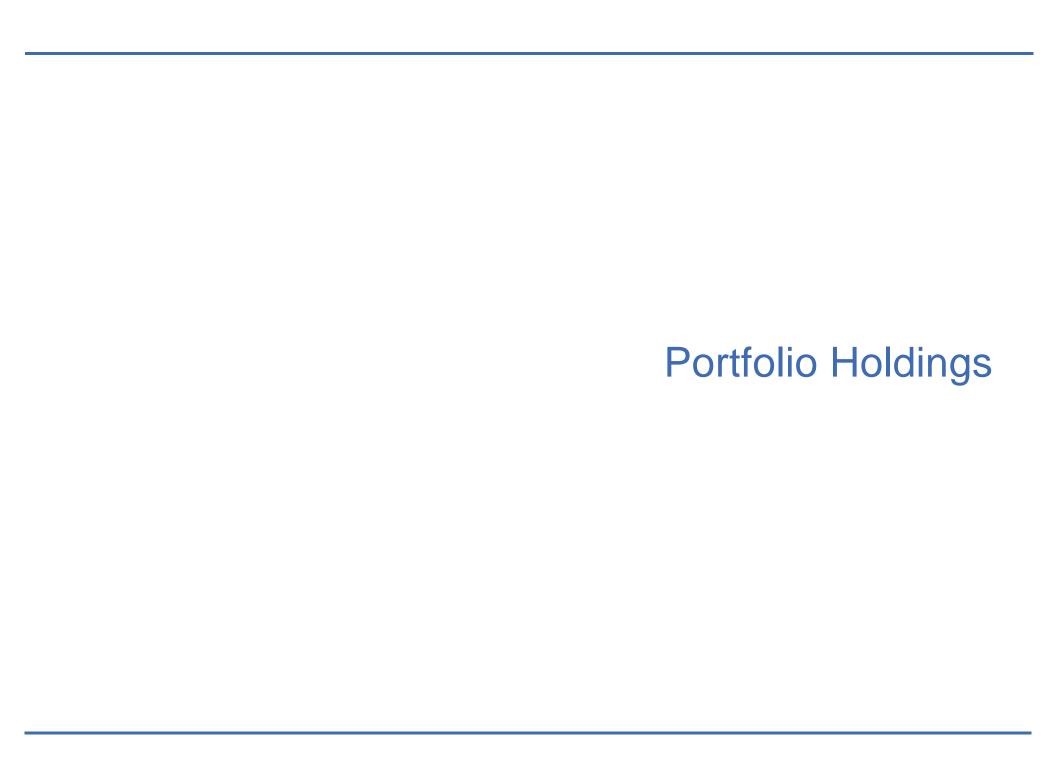

GLOSSARY

- ACCRUED INTEREST: Interest that is due on a bond or other fixed income security since the last interest payment was made.
- AGENCIES: Federal agency securities and/or Government-sponsored enterprises.
- AMORTIZED COST: The original cost of the principal of the security is adjusted for the amount of the periodic reduction of any discount or premium from the purchase
 date until the date of the report. Discount or premium with respect to short-term securities (those with less than one year to maturity at time of issuance) is amortized
 on a straight line basis. Such discount or premium with respect to longer-term securities is amortized using the constant yield basis.
- BANKERS' ACCEPTANCE: A draft or bill or exchange accepted by a bank or trust company. The accepting institution guarantees payment of the bill as well as the
 insurer.
- COMMERCIAL PAPER: An unsecured obligation issued by a corporation or bank to finance its short-term credit needs, such as accounts receivable and inventory.

- NEGOTIABLE CERTIFICATES OF DEPOSIT: A CD with a very large denomination, usually \$1 million or more, that can be traded in secondary markets.
- PAR VALUE: The nominal dollar face amount of a security.
- PASS THROUGH SECURITY: A security representing pooled debt obligations that passes income from debtors to its shareholders. The most common type is the
 mortgage-backed security.

GLOSSARY

- REPURCHASE AGREEMENTS: A holder of securities sells these securities to an investor with an agreement to repurchase them at a fixed price on a fixed date.
- **SETTLE DATE:** The date on which the transaction is settled and monies/securities are exchanged. If the settle date of the transaction (i.e., coupon payments and maturity proceeds) occurs on a non-business day, the funds are exchanged on the next business day.
- TRADE DATE: The date on which the transaction occurred; however, the final consummation of the security transaction and payment has not yet taken place.
- UNSETTLED TRADE: A trade which has been executed; however, the final consummation of the security transaction and payment has not yet taken place.
- U.S. TREASURY: The department of the U.S. government that issues Treasury securities.
- YIELD: The rate of return based on the current market value, the annual interest receipts, maturity value, and the time period remaining until maturity, stated as a percentage on an annualized basis.
- YTM AT COST: The yield to maturity at cost is the expected rate of return based on the original cost, the annual interest receipts, maturity value, and the time period from purchase date to maturity, stated as a percentage on an annualized basis.
- YTM AT MARKET: The yield to maturity at market is the rate of return based on the current market value, the annual interest receipts, maturity value, and the time period remaining until maturity, stated as a percentage on an annualized basis.

Subject: Halsey House Study Session Consultant Support

Purpose

To approve a contract amendment with the Architectural Resource Group, to provide the additional information requested by City Council, and to appropriate additional funding to the project.

Background

At the March 23, 2021 City Council meeting, staff presented its report relating to determining a process to proceed with regarding the future of the Halsey House in Redwood Grove. The report included observations and challenges from the February 10, 2021 Parks and Recreation Commission meetings as well as from other public meetings throughout the years.

Some of the challenges to developing a recommendation for the future of the House included several policy related questions including what the main decision driver(s) for staff and the commissions is to follow. The report also noted there have been times when policy related questions blended with technical questions which has led to further confusion relating to the decision-making process.

Discussion/Analysis

As a result of the Council discussion on March 23, 2021, the Council determined all four of the building structure options were to be considered as part of the analysis regarding the future of the Halsey House. The four options under consideration being: full rehabilitation and adaptive reuse of the building, full demolition of the building, partial demolition/major alteration, and mothballing the building. Council also identified several additional questions it would like answered before it considers the next steps in the decision-making process. The additional questions are included as Attachment 1.

Council also endorsed discussing the policy and process related questions in a Study Session to allow for more dialog and discussion with Council, the community, historic structure experts, and staff. Staff solicited proposals from the Architectural Resources Group (ARG), David J. Powers and Associates (DJP&A), and Page &Turnbull to address both the questions raised in the March 23, 2021 staff report and those suggested by the City Council.

ARG would address the cost estimating, adaptive reuse, site access, and step process for each of the four options under consideration. DJP&A would respond to California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) related questions requested by Council. The firm Page & Turnbull would provide a Historic Resource Evaluation of the Halsey House itself. The scope of work for each consultant includes deliverable reports and attendance at a future Council Study Session and Regular Meeting. Compensation for each of the professional services agreements are in the amounts not to exceed should Council desire to change or modify the requested information.

Staff will schedule a Study Session in the future after it receives the requested information for the consultant firms.

Los Altos will always have limited Engineering Resource and must focus on priorities.

I recommend you continue this agenda item for low priority Halsey House to a date after Engineering Resource is allocated to other higher priority projects. At least wait until Community Center move in is complete, EOC construction start, and Complete Streets Master Plan projects are prioritized.

Allowing Halsey House Study to move forward will require full time Engineering person to work with at least three consultants. Halsey House has already been protected from roof leaks, hillside stormwater runoff, and vandalism [eight -feet fencing around house] to ensure condition will not deteriorate while waiting for Council decision.

Higher priority projects that need Engineering Resource are as follows:

- Redwood Grove safety improvements to remove / cut-back dead redwood trees that have branches that could fall on visitors and creekbank erosion undercutting pedestrian creekside cement sidewalk that allows children to fall off of 7 feet high cliff into creek.
- Staff requested safety changes after move-in to new Community Center.
- EOC building.
- Complete Streets Master Plan top safety improvement projects.
- Grant Park Master Plan building improvements
- Police Station building safety improvements.
- Decision on 999 Fremont

Council should always consider impact on Staff availability to work on new projects and possible impact on other projects before approving. It may be helpful for Engineering Resource impact be included in project staff reports.

RESOLUTION NO. 2021-24

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOS ALTOS TAKING A LEADERSHIP ROLE ON AN ISSUE NEGATIVELY IMPACTING THE LOS ALTOS COMMUNITY

WHEREAS, at the regular meeting of the Los Altos City Council on November 24, 2020, a Los Altos resident, Kenan Moos, sent Council Member Lynette Lee Eng the following text messages after Council Member Lee Eng asked about the cost of employing a 3rd party to provide intake services for the Los Altos Police Department:

"Your name will be all over the papers. We know there are racists that supported you. You are trying to delay this."

"It has nothing to do with budget and you know this."

"You lied to me in our discussions that you were going to support racial matters. You said you were the only one in favor and it looks like you are the only one against them. Very disappointing;" and

WHEREAS, Council Member Lee Eng did not read Mr. Moos' text messages out loud, but made the following statement ("November 24th Statement") on the public record:

"Before we move forward onto that item, I just want to make a comment that the reason why I voted what I did is because I'm getting information or comments from members of V anguard calling me racist now so I don't appreciate it. And I would like to state that I did it because I lacked information and there are other reasons why I took the position that I have. I'm making this known public because if anything were to occur to me or my family, I'm making it known that I voted the way I did and I'm representing my concerns because of lack of information and because I had concerns moving forward. So, that said, I'm just want to protect myself and protect my family. Thank you. Now we can move on;" and

WHEREAS, after Council Member Lee Eng made her November 24th Statement, Mr. Moos then sent her the following text message during the meeting:

"I just want to be clear, this is no way a threat of any kind. This is me expressing my disappointment;" and

WHEREAS, Council Member Lee Eng never read this last text message from Mr. Moos into the record; and

WHEREAS, Council Member Lee Eng knows Mr. Moos and had communicated with him multiple times before he sent her these text messages; and

WHEREAS, although Council Member Lee Eng did not use the word "threat," many individuals, after hearing Council Member Lee Eng's November 24th Statement, said they thought Mr. Moos had physically threatened Council Member Lee Eng and her family; and

WHEREAS, at the November 24, 2020 regular City Council meeting, in reaction to the November 24th Statement, the other four Council Members and the City Attorney made comments including "Lynette, if those emails were sent by email, I think you should send them on to the City Manager or the Police Chief. That would be important to have those emails sent in;" and

WHEREAS, since the November 24, 2020 meeting, members of the public, including many constituents, have sent emails to Los Altos Council Members and spoken at every regular City Council meeting on this issue. Members of the public sought some form of closure on this issue for the community and many asked Council Member Lee Eng, among other things, to address the impact of the November 24th Statement and her subsequent refusal for 5 months to respond to her constituents and the community; and

WHEREAS, although both parties had agreed to participate in mediation in an attempt to resolve this issue, the mediator canceled the mediation; and

WHEREAS, when Council Member Lee Eng made a statement five months later at the April 27th, 2021 regular City Council meeting (the "April 27th Statement"), she did not address many of the issues raised by her constituents, including

- that her November 24th Statement was wrongly perceived and/or understood by many that Mr. Moos had physically threatened her and her family in his text messages,
- addressing the impact of that wrongful perception and understanding, and
- admitting that Mr. Moos did not call her racist; and

WHEREAS, as of the date of this Resolution, Council Member Lee Eng still had not responded to these specific issues raised by her constituents, and this situation continues to consume a significant portion of Council time and staff time; and

WHEREAS, the City Council believes leadership is necessary to directly address this situation and the impact on the community; and

WHEREAS, this Resolution does not seek to punish, embarrass, or discipline any City Council Member or member of the community, nor does it question how anyone may have felt when they read the text messages.

NOW THEREFORE, by this resolution, the Los Altos City Council

- acknowledges that at the regular meeting of the Los Altos City Council on November 24, 2020, in his text messages to Council Member Lee Eng, Mr. Kenan Moos:
 - a. DID NOT physically threaten Council Member Lynette Lee Eng;
 - b. DID NOT mention Council Member Lee Eng's family, or threaten them in any way; and
 - c. DID NOT call Councilmember Lee Eng racist; and
- 2. is taking the leadership role necessary to respond to the concerns raised by the Council's constituents over the last six months to bring this issue to resolution.

The Los Altos City Council asks the community to join us in finding ways to move forward and to unite our community.



Dear Los Altos City Council,

I am writing in support of Resolution No. 2021-24 regarding Council members' statements related to communications between Council member Lynette Lee Eng and Justice Vanguard's Kenan Moos during the City Council meeting on November 24, 2020.

I was at the meeting when the exchange happened, listening in very late that night, because I care deeply about racial justice issues. Racism has affected our family, and many people we know and are close to. My heart sank when Ms. Lee Eng interrupted the meeting to declare she felt her family was not safe after reading Mr. Moos' texts. The Council members assumed she had been threatened. She had not, and she said nothing to clarify the facts at that time or in subsequent meetings. Many people knew who she was referring to. Kenan Moos is one of the faces of Justice Vanguard, and she had corresponded with Kenan multiple times prior to the meeting about the issues being voted on that night.

Concerned citizens have been to every council meeting since November, speaking in support of Mr. Moos because he was falsely accused of issuing a threat and the Council took part in that wrongful accusation. Elected officials are legally bound to take criticism, and may not actively work to silence those who disagree with them. A city Council "shall not prohibit public criticism of the policies, procedures, programs, or services of the agency, or of the acts or omissions of the legislative body." Gov't Code § 54954.3 (c).

If this false accusation had been made against our son, we would have pursued legal action against Ms. Lee Eng and the City Council, and that is why I am writing today. This resolution needs to pass. This cannot happen again, to anyone, or to the City. There are other important matters for City Council to spend their time and resources on. Please clear Mr. Moos' name. It doesn't matter how old he is, or that he is a student, or that he texted her during a meeting.

Council Norm 6.8 forbids Council Members from reading emails and texts during meetings.

Council Norms do not apply to the general public.

6.8. Use of Electronic Devices during Council Meetings. City Councilmembers shall not use electronic devices to send or receive communications regarding agenda items or to access information which other Councilmembers do not have equal access to during a meeting of the City Council at which he or she is in attendance. This does not apply to receipt of telephone calls or text messages from family members in the event of an urgent family matter. Councilmembers responding to such a message during the meeting shall do so in a manner that does not disrupt the meeting.

Please right the wrong that has been committed and heal our community. Set the record straight with the facts as you have stated in the resolution. Set the precedent so this never happens again, and allow our community to begin to heal from this injustice.

For people who wish to know the context I'm writing this from, I am also a Los Altos High Graduate, from 2017.

I remember when I was at Los Altos High that Mr. Donnelly, back then my Economics teacher, also taught us how to participate in Civil Discourse. To participate legally, in a civil, and non-threatening manner. Back in 2017, the High School student body organized a civil protest march against repealing DACA with the assistance of Mr. Donnelly. The key thing in that protest: was to not bring up any racist stereotypes. To not bring up things that would be seen as harmful to others.

Per the Mountain View Voice, the protesters brought signs that read "education not deportation", "we stand with Dreamers", and chanted "no hate, no fear, everyone is welcome here." [1]

This is what I consider proper civil discourse. To talk about it calmly, with no language that can be seen as inflammatory.

The issue at hand? The language used is anything but "not inflammatory".

I wonder what has happened with how us students have changed from 4 years ago.

Right now, we are at an impasse. This situation, which was started from Councilor Lee-Eng changing their mind, has blown up into places that I would never expect or want out of this. This story has broken on our local Town Crier multiple times [2] [3], on National News via Fox News [4], and even overseas via the Daily Mail in the United Kingdom [5].

I am stunned about how the Council and Mr. Moos with the Justice Vanguard, has handled this.

I'm stunned that the Council has not been able to do anything about this until now with the Draft Resolution at hand.

And, I am stunned and equally disappointed at Mr. Moos with the Justice Vanguard, with the choice of language He decided to use to express his "disappointment".

We have many ways to express disappointment. In fact, the last text sent would have been enough:

"You lied to me in our discussions that you were going to support racial matters. You said you were the only one in favor and it looks like you are the only one against them. Very disappointing."

This already conveys the disappointment that Mr. Moos, his family, and the Justice Vanguard had with the actions of the night. And that would be the "be all and end all" to the situation.

But no. Of course that wasn't enough for some. And it has brought us here today.

A lesson that my family has taught me, along with the school system in general, is that you and only you are solely responsible for your own actions. Doubly so if it's in the public record.

The proposed resolution at hand reads to me like a "Free Pass." To allow Mr. Moos to avoid the backlash of communicating inflammatory words while also claiming to have triumphed over the Council.

You don't get both ways. You either say the words and deal with whatever comes, good and bad; or you don't say it in the first place.

I've learned from this council that items passed in the past will be a template for the future. If this continues to be the case, it would mean that when situations like this occur in the future, this is the response the council will take.

I, personally, do not want this behavior to ever be considered acceptable. Calling someone out with "We know there are racists that supported you." (sic) is a chilling effect. Plain and Simple. More so with the current environment, where Asian Americans in general are facing more hate crime than ever because of COVID-19 per NBC News, the BBC, and even Fox News. [6][7][8]

I ask the council to vote NO on the resolution as written.

AND

I implore the council to think very carefully about the situation at hand, and to what behavior should the council, and the general public, think is acceptable.

Because right now, if this is acceptable, I fear that legitimate concerns will be silenced and not acceptable for councilors to have, just because they are not popular.



Cancel Culture Comes to the Los Altos City Council

Censorship in America has a new name—Cancel Culture—the public shaming of someone for expressing a view that does not conform to orthodoxy. The mechanics of Cancel Culture is a display of dominance and submission. The person doing the cancelling—the canceller—turns a complex problem about which reasonable people might disagree into a binding moral certainty. He or she is then in a position to express indignation, stage a public "show trial" and then drive the person being cancelled from their job, social network, or public office. Along the way, the canceller may demand a series of apologies from the cancelled, each more abject than the next, but the apologies are a mere secondary goal; the real goal is power over other people.

Alas, Cancel Culture seems to have made its appearance in the Los Altos City Council. Its clearest expression is the campaign waged by three council members led by Mayor Neysa Fligor against Council Member Lynette Lee Eng. Mayor Fligor and Council Members Jonathan Weinberg and Sally Meadows are pressuring Council Member Lee Eng to apologize for stating that she was concerned for her safety and that of her family after receiving a series of texts sent to her by a constituent during a city council meeting.

True to the mechanics of Cancel Culture, Mayor Fligor turned a complex problem into a binding moral certainty. It does not require a Ph.D. in psychology to know that different people will respond differently to a perceived aggressive act, and that the variance in those responses will be a function of differences in personal circumstances and life history. Accordingly, it is Council Member Lee Eng's perception of texts sent to her by a constituent that should matter not Mayor Fligor's perception of them. Nevertheless, in her statement at the April 27, 2021 Council Meeting, Mayor Fligor put herself in the position of judge and jury regarding the texts in question: "when I read the messages my reaction was different because I did not see anything in the message that would make me believe that something would happen to Council Member Lee Eng or her family."

Mayor Fligor then went on to excoriate Council Member Lee Eng: "As a leader, Council Member Lee Eng, we sometimes have to do things that we may not be comfortable doing because again, it's in the best interest of our community." When Council Member Lee Eng refused to apologize for expressing concern for the safety of her family, Mayor Fligor then permitted a show trial that has now gone on for the past ten city council meetings. The mayor has allowed some constituents to use "Public Comments on Items Not on the Agenda" as a forum for public denouncement of Council Member Lee Eng. That show trial will enter a new phase at the next City Council meeting on May 25, 2021, when the Council will vote on a resolution to condemn Council Member Lee Eng for "refusing to address the concerns of her constituents."

We respectfully suggest that the Council reject this resolution, and in so doing reject Cancel Culture. The world has seen show trials being used to stifle dissent before. They did not end well. Let us not hold them in our town.

Re: AB 215 (Chiu): Housing Element; Regional Housing Need; Relative Progress Determination Notice of Opposition (As amended April 5, 2021)

Dear Assembly Member Berman:

The City of Los Altos respectfully asks that you oppose AB 215, which would create a new, mid-cycle regional housing needs progress determination process and mandates cities and counties with "low progress" in meeting those housing targets to consult with the California Department of Housing and community Development (HCD) and adopt pro-housing policies. Our chief concern is regarding the mandate to achieve HCD's designation as a pro-housing jurisdiction.

As you know, the 2019 Budget Act directed HCD to promulgate emergency regulations no later than July 1, 2021, to establish a prohousing designation program. AB 215 turns what was intended to be an incentive program into a mandatory requirement for cities to adopt state supported policies and strategies regardless of whether those policies and strategies would result in increased housing development and whether those policies and strategies are appropriate for our community.

We also question whether the "relative progress" metric is truly calibrated to produce the intended outcome. The cycle of moving from development proposal to entitlement to building permit – the point at which a project would be "counted" in reporting to HCD – takes at least 18 months, assuming the developer moves forward. This leaves little time for cities to show the required progress mid-cycle. Further, the bill takes no account of possible economic forces outside the city's control that might deter developers from moving to the permitting stage and actual construction.

Several recent changes in the law have given the State new enforcement tools. HCD can review any action or failure to act by a jurisdiction that is inconsistent with the jurisdiction's adopted housing element; revoke the Departments' prior findings that a city's housing element is compliant; and refer a non-compliant city to the Attorney General, who can in turn bring the city to court to compel compliance. The State should remain focused on using the tools in existing law to promote housing element adoption and implementation.

Los Altos remains committed to increasing affordable housing. However, we cannot support the transition of an incentive-based approach to a mandatory program, especially considering that the prohousing program has yet even to be implemented.

For these reasons, we ask you to vote NO on AB 215 on the Assembly Floor.

RE: AB 1401 (Friedman) Residential and Commercial Development. Parking Requirements. Notice of Opposition (As Amended April 19, 2021)

Dear Assembly Member Berman:

The City of los Altos must respectfully ask that you oppose AB 1401 (Friedman), which would prohibit a local government from imposing a minimum automobile parking requirement, or enforcing a minimum automobile parking requirement, on residential, commercial, or other development if the development is located on a a parcel within one-half mile walking distance of public transit.

AB 1401 would essentially allow developers to dictate parking requirements in vast areas of our city because the definition of public transit includes entire bus corridors, not just high frequency bus stops or major transit stops. Restricting parking requirements within one half- mile walking distance of a high-quality transit corridor does not guarantee individuals living, working, or shopping on those parcels will have access to public transit since proximity to a corridor does not equate to a convenient bus stop.

AB 1401 would give both developers and transit agencies the power to determine parking requirements. transit agencies would be able to dramatically alter local parking standards by shifting transit routes and adjusting service intervals, with no guarantee that such service would even be in place at the time a given project is completed.

AB 1401 could negatively impact the application of the State's Density Bonus Law by providing developers parking concessions without also requiring developers to include affordable housing units in the project. The purpose of the Density Bonus Law is to provide concessions and waivers to developers in exchange for affordable housing units.

We recognize that amendments have allowed for imposition of some requirements regarding electric vehicles. However, as amended, and while well intended, AB 1401 prevents local jurisdictions from establishing appropriate parking requirements based on community needs. A one-size fits all approach to an issue that is project and location specific just does not work. For these reasons, we ask for your NO vote on AB 1401 on the Assembly Floor.

SB 16 (Skinner) Peace Officers. Release of Records Notice of Opposition (As Amended May 20, 2021)

Dear Senator Becker:

The City of Los Altos must respectfully oppose SB 16. While the overly punitive imposition of fines and other monetary damages have been removed from the original bill, the measure remains excessive in the types of personnel records it makes subject to disclosures.

We support maintaining the confidentiality of personnel matters and protecting public safety personnel discipline records from public disclosure, as appropriate.

As amended, SB 16 would unjustifiably expand SB 1421 by providing for the disclosure of police personnel records for every incident involving use of force, regardless of whether the officer was exonerated or if a complaint was not sustained. This provision is neither practical from an administrative standpoint nor helpful toward to objective of fostering trust between law enforcement and the communities they serve. The release of officer records for every single incident involving any use of force, or an allegation of unreasonable or excessive force – especially those in which the officer is entirely within departmental policy – will generate the misperception that there was "something wrong" with the officer's conduct.

Our communities can benefit from continued dialogue around law enforcement review and discipline. Unfortunately, this measure is not limited in how it would open police officer personnel records to the public. This policy imbalance that prioritizes public disclosure of records over an officer's privacy, regardless of whether they were proven to have exhibited proper conduct, is disconcerting.

For these reasons, the City of Los Altos opposes SB 16 and asks for your NAY vote on the Senate Floor.

The building will contain modern amenities, be sustainably designed and provide facilities that are both adequate and useful to the community. The architecture will be inviting and showcase the unique character of the City of Los Altos, with the building located in a beautiful park-like setting.





Project Summary

The Hillview Community Center located at 97 Hillview Avenue, Los Altos was constructed in the 1940s and 1950s as an elementary school and has served as a community center since 1975. The buildings were originally constructed as woodframe and steel structures and had undergone numerous additions, renovations, and upgrades over more than 70 years. The scope of this project is to demolish the existing 30,362 square-foot community center, re-designing the site, retaining 71 existing trees, and constructing a new one-story 24,500 square-foot community center building occupying a location at the north end of the present community center site. Pedestrian pathways and crosswalks will be provided throughout the site to connect the parking lots and existing sidewalks to the new buildings, recreational facilities, and existing buildings surrounding the site such as the History Museum and Library. The driveway connections to Hillview Avenue will be realigned, with a total of two driveway connections rather than the existing four driveway entrances. The site will function more efficiently and provide a better connection to the existing buildings within the Civic Center.

The construction phase of the project began with bidding and subsequent City Council approval of the construction contract in July 2019. The project budget approved by City Council for the entire project is \$38,335,400 which includes all soft costs, hard costs and furniture for the new building.

The construction work is being performed by Gonsalves & Stronck Construction Company, Inc. Demolition of the site began in September 2019 and the buildings were demolished in October 2019. Through April 2021, exterior sitework and flatwork is nearly complete, and interior finishes and mechanical systems are being finalized.

In accordance with the shelter-in-place order issued by Santa Clara County, on March 31, 2020, in response to COVID-19, work on-site was suspended until the revised County order on April 29, 2020. Work resumed, with new health and safety requirements, on May 4, 2020. Following a confirmed cased of COVID-19, the site was voluntarily closed for sanitization on September 11, 2020 and reopened September 15, 2020 in accordance with the contractor's protocols.

The original November 25, 2020 substantial completion date reflected in the bid will be extended. Substantial completion is currently anticipated in May, 2021. The completion date may continue to be adjusted as impacts from COVID-19 are realized. For more details on the budget and schedule, see pages 9 & 10 and Appendices A & B enclosed.








Exterior Progress at Courtyard






Exterior ADA Truncated Domes





To date, four issues have been encountered that delayed progress:

- 1. PG&E delay in capping off the gas line in the street delayed progress by 7 working days.
- Unforeseen below-grade conditions encountered during demolition delayed progress by an additional 7 working days.
- 3. Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, the construction site was closed between March 30, 2020 and May 4, 2020. Ongoing impacts to construction productivity, material and equipment fabrication, deliveries, manpower availability, and external organizations such as Cal Water, PG&E, Santa Clara County Fire Department that are required for reviews and inspections, are all being impacted. Schedules are being evaluated and adjusted in accordance with the construction contract.
- 4. Following a confirmed case of COVID-19, the site was voluntarily closed for sanitization on September 11, 2020 and reopened on September 15, 2020 in accordance with the contractor's protocols. This closure resulted in a delay of **2 working days**.

Dates, durations and sequence indicated for each activity are subject to a variety of factors including weather, construction timing, and phasing of the construction and may be adjusted as the project progresses. The baseline schedule assumes 20 weather delay days. Accordingly, rain days do not pushout the overall completion date. The project has encountered 8 inclement weather delay days to date. The substantial completion date is currently anticipated to be May, 2021, and the completion date may be further revised as impacts related to COVID-19 are experienced, evaluated, and addressed. A detailed construction schedule is included in Appendix B.

The original contractual completion for the project was 450 calendar days from Start of Construction date, with anticipated Completion in November, 2020. Currently, executed change orders have extended the contract duration 19 days. A contract extension to address delays due to COVID-19 is under negotiation.


