



## **ZONE 3 NEIGHBORHOOD COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT MEETING SUMMARY**

### **SUMMARY**

Issues:

- 999 Fremont Ave. “Loyola Corners”
  - Safety and Vision are the biggest two concerns
  - Dangerous for pedestrians and cyclists, especially on A Street
  - If 999 Fremont is going to be built, then there should be bike lane, sidewalks, and street improvements.
- Communication
  - The City needs to do a better job of communicating.
  - Didn't know what this meeting was about.
  - Effective methods are emailing to neighborhoods, texts, Town Crier
- 5G
  - The City didn't do a good enough job of communicating about the 5G issue
- Public Input
  - Concerns about residents getting less than 3 minutes.
  - Curious about creating a process where residents can sign up to get their full 3 minutes
- Process
  - Want to have these meetings at least twice a year in the different zones
  - Food
  - Communicate to everyone, not just Nextdoor
- Fremont Ave project
  - Make the “Keep Clear” areas at intersections wide enough to allow for queueing capacity for cars turning on to Fremont
  - Add flashing beacons or lit crosswalks at the existing and proposed crosswalks.
  - Better lighting at Fremont and Truman
- Oak/Truman
  - Crossing guard for traffic and safety.

Questions:

What is the setback for 999 Fremont Ave?

There are sidewalks on two sides of the building (Fremont and Miramonte), but no sidewalks planned for A street. The building will go right up to sidewalk on Fremont and Miramonte, and have a small green space on A Street.

What is the City's policy on residential gleaning?

The City doesn't have a specific policy on this, but if any residents or non-profits would like to glean any produce then they need to contact the property owner and get their permission.
