SUBJECT: City Council Priorities Recommendations Letter

RECOMMENDATION:

Provide Input on Proposed Letter to the Los Altos City Council regarding Complete Streets Commission interest in City Council's Transportation Priorities.

INTRODUCTION

The Los Altos City Council develops annual City Council Priorities to guide policy and project implementation for the City each year. The City Council Priorities also serve as a tool to measure City Council and City Staff performance annually.

The Complete Streets Commission requested at its December 2020 meeting that a letter be developed and submitted to the City Council for their January 30, 2021 City Council Priorities study session and that the comment letter also include the Complete Streets Commission draft work plan. A draft comment letter and the draft version of the commission's work plan is attached for review by the commission.

BACKGROUND

The Complete Streets Commission requested development of a comment letter for submittal to the City Council to help advise the City Council on its own interests regarding City Council Priorities as part of the 2021 calendar year. The Complete Streets Commission Vice-Chair, Stacy Banerjee, drafted the attached letter for review and comment by the commission.

DISCUSSION

The Complete Streets Commission comment letter to the City Council on City Council Priorities is focused on the commissions developing work plan. The commission work plan subcommittee team members include: Vice Chair Stacy Banerjee, Commissioner Cynthia O'Yang, and Staff Liaison Jaime Rodriguez. The attached draft comment letter was developed by Vice Chair Stacey Banerjee and includes the most current draft copy of the commission's work plan.

Honorable Los Altos Mayor, Vice-Mayor, and Councilmembers,

The Complete Streets Commission is interested in the City Council's upcoming City Council Priorities study session. In years past the commission has not provided direct input to the City Council as it developed its annual priorities. But this year the commission is interested in sharing its Work Plan to help advise the City Council on its priority's development.

The Complete Streets Commission believes it is in alignment with the City Council regarding the advancement of complete streets initiatives in the City. The active Complete Streets Master Plan project, prioritized by both the City Council and the Complete Streets Commission, demonstrates our common interest in seeing positive transformation in street design in the City. The Complete Streets Commission has articulated the necessity to create a visioning statement and supporting criteria for the Complete Streets Master Plan and has directed staff to develop such workshop ASAP. This year the Complete Streets Commission is working closely with City staff in the Engineering Services Department to align the CIP - Street Maintenance Programs (i.e. paving) with the Complete Streets Master Plan project so the City can use active projects to implement complete streets initiatives. The commission also undertakes many other responsibilities.

In advance of your annual priority setting and council offsite meeting, the Complete Streets Commission has outlined its own CSC priorities for your review:

- 1. Create safe multi-modal transportation solutions that align community needs with city priorities.
- 2. Manage long-term cumulative impacts from public and private development projects, and regional traffic.
- 3. Achieve effective community engagement with residents.

For each of these three priorities, we have detailed specific goals with underlying projects and programs that are outlined in the attached Complete Streets Commission - Work Plan document along with our tentative meeting calendar for this year. We will work to build out and refine key performance indicators, including timeline for each of the projects and programs. This is a multi-year plan, which our commission will update annually.

Please let us know if you have any feedback, input, or questions as you set annual citywide priorities. In addition, we will be reviewing this plan with you in more detail during our annual joint session currently scheduled for May 4, 2021.
