SUBJECT: Receive report from Santa Clara Office of Sustainability staff on the BayREN

Energy Program

BACKGROUND

Santa Clara County Office of Sustainability is involved with BayREN, Bay Area Regional Energy Network, a collaboration of the 9 counties that make up the San Francisco Bay Area. BayREN implements effective energy saving programs on a regional level and is funded by California utility ratepayers under the auspices of the California Public Utilities Commission.

DISCUSSION

Staff from the Santa Clara Office of Sustainability will make a presentation at the September 12, 2016 Environmental Commission meeting to discuss the BayREN program and provide materials on effective energy saving programs available to residents of the City. In addition, a workshop will be held on October 18, 2016 from 6:30 pm to 8 pm at Hillview Community Center to provide information on home energy efficiency for residents. Countywide Opportunities & Resources

- CodeCycle E-Tool BayREN is recruiting interested local jurisdictions to help demonstrate the potential
 of electronic tools to improve energy code enforcement and permitting. BayREN will provide free
 technical assistance to implement the tool, and a stipend for local jurisdiction staff time.
- California Reach Code Tracker Tool The Statewide Codes & Standards Team has designed an online reach code tracking tool to help jurisdictions demonstrate energy and GHG savings generated by reach codes. Jurisdictional recruitment is ongoing.
- Reach Codes & ZNE Support BayREN offers local jurisdictions assistance for reach code
 implementation and ZNE policy and projects. Support options include: cost effectiveness analysis, CEC
 submittal templates, tracking tools, design assistance and cost analysis for municipal projects, and
 resource toolkits.
- Regional Collaborative Services Agreement (RCSA) for Residential PACE In order to safeguard
 consumer interests and promote program success, ABAG, through BayREN developed the RCSA which
 establishes the terms, conditions and roles each residential PACE provider will follow when operating
 in ABAG territory.
