SUBJECT: Commission Work Plan and Accomplishments

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Accept the 2016-2017 Historical Commission Goals and Work Plan

## BACKGROUND

At the July 1, 2015 joint meeting between the City Council and the Historical Commission, the Commission discussed the below goals and work plan for 2015-2016. The list includes all of the Commission's goals and work plan for 2016-2017 to:

- 1. Administer the Margaret Thompson Essay Contest.
- 2. Continue to implement the Historic Plaque Program.
- 3. Administer the Historic Preservation Award.
- 4. Maintain the City's Certified Local Government (CLG) status by reviewing and approving the annual CLG report that is submitted to the State Office of Historic Preservation, and seek historic education and training.
- 5. Foster Partnership with the Los Altos Museum by holding an annual joint meeting with the History Museum Board of Directors and pursuing opportunities to partner with the Museum on historic education and outreach
- 6. Update the Historic Commission Website with information on structures participating in the Historic Plaque program.
- 7. Continue to maintain and improve the Historical Commission's community outreach and awareness by collaborating with the Los Altos History Museum and administering the annual Margaret Thompson Essay Contest.

8. Continue to foster a partnership with the History Museum in order to best utilize the Museum's resources for projects such as evaluating historic properties for their association with significant individuals and events.

### DISCUSSION

The City Council recently adopted a new work plan layout. The work plan is organizationally similar to the previous layout, but it requires the following new information:

- 1. Goals are required to indicate the city priority related to it; and
- 2. Assignments are required to indicate the Commissioner assigned to the item.

Staff has revised the work plan to address the new layout. Additionally, staff has updated the work plan to clarify the target dates and the status of each goal.
