Overview of the Centennial Celebration

The Los Altos Library "Then and Now" show celebrated the library's history and service from 1914 to the present day, entertaining and educating 2,087 people who came to enjoy the event - almost twice that of a regular Saturday.

At 9:30 a.m. outside the library, the festivities began. Customers enjoyed free coffee and pastries, a jazz combo, a Penny-Farthing Bicycle show, and a cavalcade of cars depicting vehicles from each decade, from the 1914 Model T, to the 2014 Tessla. Boy Scout Troop 31 led us in the Pledge of Allegiance and the Town Crier rang in the event, heralding opening statements and a joint proclamation presentation by Los Altos Hills Mayor John Bradford, and Los Altos Mayor Megan Satterlee. County Supervisor Joe Simitian spoke in support of libraries, followed by Director Nancy Howe who gave a tribute to long time Los Altos Librarian Carol Tefft.

The fun continued inside the library with a full morning of children's programs as well as a "Then and Now" presentation of the library's history as it unfolded on our digital screens. Wall panels illustrating library locations during the past century, as well as portraits of the librarians who managed them, were of great interest and drew a crowd, but the biggest draw, apart from the children's programs, was the 3D Printer in full printing mode making small items to give away.

Children celebrated with magic, music, costumes and animal balloons. Other featured attractions include a plaque in honor of Carol Tefft, former Los Altos librarian, a display by the Native Plant Society, watercolors by the Los Altos Art Club, and ceramics by the Orchard Valley Ceramic Art Guild. Music was provided by the 'Bout Time Blue Grass Band, Park Avenue Jazz and the Palo Alto Philharmonic Quartet, prompting many customers to seek out staff to thank us for the music and a festive day. # Programs Offered: 16 # People: 2111

Family Games Afternoon Celebrating Games by the Decade




