
LOS ALTOS LIBRARY AND WOODLAND BRANCH

HIGHLIGHTS



The Los Altos Library hosted two celebrity storytimes for Silicon Valley Reads. The storytime on March 14 featured Santa Clara County Supervisor Joe Simitian and the storytime on March 28 featured Mayor Lynette Lee Eng. The children and caregivers enjoyed readings by our local celebrities followed by songs and activities lead by our librarian, Jean Nei.



Children in grades 3 through 7 made light boxes. Students learned basic circuitry using copper tape and LED lights with their circuit placed inside a box. They decorated their box cover with an Ellison die cutout covered with tissue paper through which the light would glow.



Children and caregivers enjoyed dancing and singing to the music of Lucky Diaz and the Family Jam Band. Our early literacy concerts engage the entire family in early learning. In addition to talking and reading, children build early literacy skills through playing, moving, and singing. Lucky Diaz and the Family Jam Band have been named 'The face of kindie music' by the Washington Post and PEOPLE Magazine called their album the #1 in coolest kids music.



The library hosted Ellen Harden's talk on *Monet: The Later Years*. *Monet: The Later Years* is currently on exhibit at the Legion of Honor. This exhibit features paintings inspired by his garden at Giverny: the Japanese footbridge, the house seen from the rose garden, and of course the lily pond, which offered an ever-changing reflective surface adorned with aquatic flowers.
