
STEAM programs continue to be very popular with the families in our community. Children had the opportunity to create their art bots. An extra challenge to add LED eyes was also well received by the participants.




In November, the combined circulation for Los Altos Library and the Woodland Branch was down, with 4,587 fewer items circulated than in November 2018, a 3.95% decrease. There were 204 additional visits than last November, an increase of 0.5%. 58 additional library cards were issued than in November 2018.
