



In December, the combined circulation for Los Altos Library and the Woodland Branch was up, with 7,056 fewer items circulated than November 2019, a 5.6% increase. This also includes a 2.6% increase compared to December 2018. There were 324 additional visits than last December, an increase of 0.8%. 43 additional library cards were issued than in December 2018.

STATISTICS: PROGRAMS, OUTREACH, VOLUNTEER HOURS

In December, the Los Altos Library and Woodland Branch presented a combined total of 81 programs for children, teens and adults with almost 3000 attendees. We went out on 2 outreach events with the GoGo Biblio and interacted with over 37 individuals. Our dedicated volunteers donated over 1500 hours of their time to the library.



The Library eCard gives you access to our entire online library, available 24/7, including eBooks, audiobooks, downloadable movies, music, magazines, newspapers, international content, online learning, research and more. Completing this form now will provide you with free, instant access to a vast digital collection. There are never any late fees or due dates to remember.

Library eCards are available to those residing in the Santa Clara County Library District. Full-Membership Cards, which can be provided to you, free, when you visit a library, are available to residents of the United States. Full-Membership Cards provide access to both physical and digital collections.

As part of our new website, we now offer patrons the opportunity to get an instant free card. The URL takes patrons to a short form to fill out that will grant them instant access to the library's online resources, available 24/7. Patrons can then come into the library to turn their eCard into a full service card if they want to check out physical items from the library. This is a great resource for those who do not have a SCCLD card and may be too busy to visit the library.
