
- Woodland Temporary Closure started after 10/10

BOOK DASH

- Experimental direct home delivery service from the Bookmobile department
 - For homebound patrons
 - Those with poor access to transportation
 - Patrons with health concerns because of COVID and unable to physically come to the library
- Trial in the Woodland Library neighborhood first
