New County Poet Laureate Tapped for 2022-23 Term

The County Board of Supervisors <u>appointed</u> Tshaka Campbell to be the seventh County Poet Laureate on January 11. The honorary position is charged with promoting the art form through appearances at local community events and working to instill a passion for poetry among the public.

Campbell is a multi-talented individual who has written several books of poetry, performed in multiple poetry contests across the country, and released multiple music albums. He has already leaped into his new role, also taking advantage of social media platforms (<u>Facebook</u>, <u>Instagram</u>, <u>Twitter</u>).



SCCLD is working with SVCreates to provide support for the mission of the Poet Laureate. A <u>new page</u> on the Library District's website contains general information about the Poet Laureate and lists upcoming events featuring Campbell as well as other local poetry groups being hosted at our libraries. Campbell will be formally introduced at the <u>Board of Supervisors meeting</u> at 9:30 on Tuesday, February 8. As part of the invocation, he will also read a selection of his work as part of the online meeting.

Black History Month Library Events

February was selected as the month to celebrate Black History due to the birthdays of abolitionist Frederick Douglas and the Great Emancipator, Abraham Lincoln.

SCCLD has several virtual events planned during the month on topics including a teen workshop on <u>microaggressions</u>, lessons on how to make <u>soul food</u>, a <u>film discussion</u> about slavery, a history of Black American <u>Quilts</u>, and a talk about inventor <u>George</u> <u>Washington Carver</u>. There will also be a special author Q&A next month with James Beard award-winning chef <u>Bryant Terry</u>.

Several libraries will be offering a Black History trivia challenge to test your knowledge about important black figures from American history. Look for copies at the Adult Reference Desks. Keep an eye out as well for Black History Month book displays at libraries.


