City Council Findings We Must Do Something

- Buildings are in Need of Repair
- Poor Site Access and Traffic Flow
- Inadequate Parking
- Inadequate Senior, Youth and Recreational Facilities
- New Space (City Hall and Police Station)
- 18 Acre Site is Very Under Utilized



City Council Initiative Appointed Task Force

- Develop Vision Statement
- Begin Public Engagement
 - discuss needs and site potential
 - seek community input
- Report Back to City Council





Task Force What They Have Been Doing

The Los Altos Community Center will provide a community experience that will serve your public for the next 50 years.







Los Altos Demographics (2000 Census)








Family (w/ children under 18 yrs)



Los Altos Growth Projections (2000-2030)



Los Altos Hills Growth Projections (2000-2030)





- Of the List of Service Elements (current and future services) which are the most important for the City to deliver? Which need the most improvement?






