# RE: LOS ALTOS COMMUNITY CENTER MASTER PLAN CULTURAL RESOURCES STUDY, LOS ALTOS, SANTA CLARA COUNTY, CALIFORNIA

On October 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2008 I completed an archaeological field inspection of the above referenced project area located in Los Altos. No evidence of prehistoric or historic archaeological resources was found either during the archaeological literature review or the field inspection. This report contains a summary of information gained to date.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The proposed project area consists of an under 20 acre irregularly shaped parcel of land containing the Los Altos City Hall, Library, youth Center, Police station and other facilities including the History House and History Museum. Located on the Mountain View U.S.G.S. map, the borders of the property are San Antonio Road on the west, Housing on the north, the Recreation Center and housing on the east, and Hawthorne Way on the south. The building complexes are located in a setting which includes open fields and orchards. At the time of the field visit all of the open ground and the orchard ground had been disced to remove any weed covering.

# ARCHIVAL RESEARCH

An archaeological literature review was undertaken by this author in person at the Northwest Information Center (NWIC) located in Rohnert Park (File no. 08-0419). The inventory has no historic or prehistoric sites located within the borders of the parcel or within a quarter mile of it. There also have been no formal archaeological field inspections of the project area, and none within a quarter mile radius.

The property does contain one recorded historic resource, the existing History House. A plaque near the stairs of the house explained that the house was built by Gilbert Smith, who bought the land in 1901, at which time he planted apricots. In 1931 he expanded the farm to 10 acres, which was bought by the City of Los Altos in 1931. Smith stayed on until his death in 1966; his wife Margaret died in 1974.

In 1977 the house became the History Museum. The House and the original 5 acres of Apricots became an official Los Altos Historical Landmark in 1987, designated at "California Point of Historical Interest Scl-058). Currently the house stands alone next to the newly constructed history museum.

# DESCRIPTION OF FIELD INSPECTION

A visual inspection of all open ground inside the project area was undertaken by this author on October 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2008. The open fields in front of and behind City Hall and surrounding the police station and bordering the soccer field were inspected by walking 20 foot transects over all the open areas.

Soils throughout the area consist of a reddish brown clay loam with scant naturally occurring gravels of basalt and siltstone. The soils, disced to a consistency of powder, were inspected for any indicators of aboriginal use typical to this part of Santa Clara County: darker than surrounding soils containing stone, bone or fresh water shellfish, evidence of fire (ash, charcoal, fire affected rock or soils), artifacts of these materials and any indications of burials, either human or animal. The surface was also inspected for any evidence of historic trash deposits which may have been created by the Smith family in the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. Historic archaeological deposits can be found in the form of filled in wells and/or privy pits or in excavated trash pits.

# FINDINGS/RECOMMENDATIONS

No evidence of either historic or prehistoric archaeological resources was found during the field inspection. Conditions for a field inspection were ideal-the ground inside the open spaces around the city buildings (partly covered with orchard) had been disced to remove all weed covering. It is evident from the uniformity of the soils viewed that this area has not been altered historically, and that if any archaeological materials (prehistoric or historic) existed in the area, the history of discing and plowing there would have brought examples of them to the surface.

It is the opinion of this author that the project area is located in a zone of low to moderate archaeological sensitivity; the nearest riparian zone (a favored Native American habitation area) is located approximately a mile to the east where Hale and Permanente Creeks merge and flow north to the bay. Adobe Creek, which runs along the foothills to the west approximately a half mile away, supported Native American habitation as it exited the hills to form the modern border

between Palo Alto and Los Altos, over two miles from the Community Center project area.

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Future development of open areas inside the project borders should have no effect on either historic or prehistoric cultural resources. This report does not recommend mechanical subsurface presence/absence testing to search for buried resources, and does not recommend archaeological monitoring of future construction related earthmoving activities.

In the unlikely event that any of the cultural materials described in this report are uncovered, work should be halted within 50 feet of the discovery until a qualified archaeologist has been retained to inspect the discovery. If it is determined that additional earthmoving will affect a resource eligible for inclusion on the California Register of Historic Resources (CRHR), a plan for its evaluation should be submitted to the Los Altos Planning Department for approval.

Evaluation is normally done through a limited program of hand excavation to sample the archaeological deposit for significant materials and/or information. In the event that evaluative testing does demonstrate that the area contains a CRHR eligible resource, a plan for mitigation of impacts to it should be submitted to the Planning Department for approval before construction work is allowed to recommence in the zone designated as archaeologically sensitive.

Mitigation can include additional data recovery through hand excavation coupled with archaeological monitoring inside the archaeological zone to insure that all significant archaeological information and material is retrieved for analysis. Monitoring also helps in the timely identification of human burials, limiting damage to them. All human remains encountered must, by law, be carefully removed from impact areas and reburied at a location agreed to between the City and the designated Most Likely Descendant along with any associated grave goods.



# LOS ALTOS, SANTA CLARA COUNTY, CALIFORNIA MOUNTAIN VIEW U.S.G.S MAP



# "LEGAL AND HISTORICAL STATUS OF THE LANDMARK APRICOT ORCHARDS OF LOS ALTOS."

## OVERVIEW

The few hundred apricot trees located near the Los Altos City Hall building and the Los Altos History Museum are the last remnants of the hundreds of acres of orchards that once blanketed the area bordered by Los Altos city boundaries. The family orchard and farm of J. Gilbert Smith was purchased by the City of Los Altos in 1954 (11/26/1954).

Over the years, many citizens and committees have acted to preserve the orchard, since it is historically significant to Los Altos' heritage. The first reference to the Los Altos Apricot Orchard as a Historical Landmark appears in 1962 in the inventory of Santa Clara Historical Landmarks. The orchard subsequently appears in the inventory of Santa Clara Historical Landmarks in 1975 and 1982.

The Los Altos Historical Commission, the Los Altos Planning Commission and the Los Altos City Council have a history of designating and preserving segments of the apricot orchard that was originally planted in 1901 by J. Gilbert Smith. These groups have passed ordinances and proclamations beginning in 1978, with more resolutions following in 1979, 1981, 1987, 1990, and 1991. These acts will be explained in more detail below.

# LEGAL ACTIONS PERTAINING TO THE LOS ALTOS CIVIC CENTER ORCHARD

(1) 1978/1979

The Los Altos City Council passed Ordinance 78-16. This established the process to be followed in designating portions of the Smith orchard as a Historical Landmark. The Los Altos Historical Commission is named the key provider of research and advice on all phases of the project, including future alterations to the orchard. The Los Altos City Council retains the final authority on this issue.

(2) 1981

The Los Altos City Council passed Resolution 81-23. This action follows the process created in 1978 and designated the orchard area surrounding what is now City Hall and the Los Altos Police Station as a Historical Landmark Orchard.

### (3) 1987

In 1987 the Orchard was designated a "Historical Point of Interest" by the California State Parks Office of Historical Preservation.

# (4) 1990

The Los Altos City Council passed Ordinance 90-225, Chapter 8. This lists many details and descriptions regarding the preservation of the orchard as a designated landmark. The Historical Commission is again named as a key provider of information and

advice to the Planning Commission and the City Council on these matters. Also included in this ordinance are the criteria of what constitutes a historical landmark and how that designation can be altered or changed by the City Council.

# (5) 1991

The City Council passed Resolution 91-31, which modified the extent of the orchard and reduced it to the area as it appears today.

The difference between an ordinance and a resolution is that an ordinance is a specific rule of law that codifies behaviors, expectations, and parameters. A resolution is a specific statement of intention and purpose. They are both laws based on the law-making power of the City Council.

# SUMMARY FINDINGS

- 1. A Historical Apricot Orchard has been a legal and integral part of the Los Altos Civic Center area since 1962.
- 2. In the years since the establishment of the Landmark Orchard, Los Altos citizens and elected representatives have shown continued support for the preservation and maintenance this historical orchard.
- 3. As recently as 2007, in two separate public meetings, strong citizen support was heard for maintaining a historical apricot orchard in the new Community Center renovation project.
- 4. The Los Altos Historical Commission and the Los Altos Planning Commission have been specifically named for providing input and advice regarding changes in the Landmark Orchard.
- 5. Other local groups, such as the Los Altos History Museum and the Los Altos Elementary School District, have a strong educational, historical, and civic interest in the preservation of the orchard.
- 6. The Los Altos City Council remains the ultimate authority regarding the disposition of the orchard.

WHEREAS, the City Council concurs with the recommendation of the Historical Commission in this regard;



Somewhere around 1901 J.Gilbert Smith, a local carpenter and orchardist, purchased 10 acres of farmland to grow apricots and as a building site for his home. The house was completed in 1905 and still remains on the site and is now used as the History House Museum. In 1954, two years after the City of Los Altos incorporated, J. Gilbert and Margaret Hill Smith sold their property to the City to build the City's Civic Center Complex. Stipulated as part of this land transfer agreement with the City, was that the couple would be allowed to reside in their house until their passing. On May 12, 1981 the City Council of Los Altos adopted Resolution No 81-23 making the J.

Gilbert Smith House and its garden land orchard a historical landmark. The house is listed with the State of California as a California Point of Historical Interest. On September 8, 1991 the City Council unanimously passed and adopted, Resolution No. 91-31 adding the Civic Center's apricot orchard along San Antonio Road to the West, the Library to the South, the Youth Center to the East, the Civic Center Parking Lot to the North, as a Historical Landmark.



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
