- 1. Was there outreach to the City of Mountain View in the process?
- 2. How did you determine short-term and long-term costs?
- 3. Where were things taken off the plan likely to be located?
- 4. There appeared to be a number of requests and goals for park-like and additional fields, open areas for community to gather, but no parks. Where is the park space in this plan and why wasn't it addressed <u>versus</u> addressing requests by special interest groups (e.g. swim) for those requesting facilities?
