

Questions raised at February 26, 2019 Los Altos City Council meeting

- How much money has been spent thus far on the Library Redevelopment Project?
- What amount of funds are currently available for the project?
- Is the current building up to earthquake code requirements? How current is the building with regards to seismic and ADA codes?
- What are the current parcel taxes and who pays them?
- What potential State tax issues may be on the ballot in 2020?
- What were the requests made by NCLA on January 14, 2019?
- What library services should be provided in a library building? What community services that may seem like library services should be provided in library vs. community center?
 - What is the capacity of the new community center?
- Why are we providing commercial tutoring space?
- Why are we not expanding the Woodland Library?
- Public Safety is a higher priority and would rather do a revenue measure for a new Police Station
- County Library System survey shows most are satisfied with the current library; we are already meeting the needs of the community
- How does a new library fit in with the long-term vision for the City?
- Where do the other City facilities rank in priority?
- How far does it make sense to go in the planning process for a new library?
- Are the construction costs per square foot still accurate? What should the costs be?
