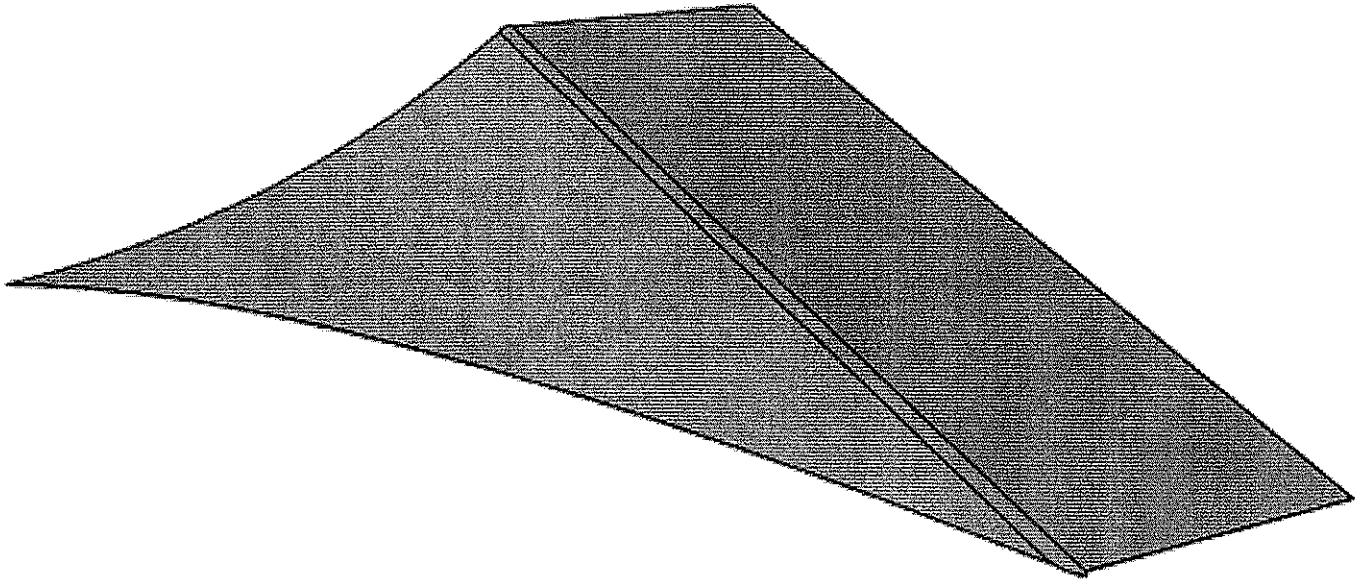


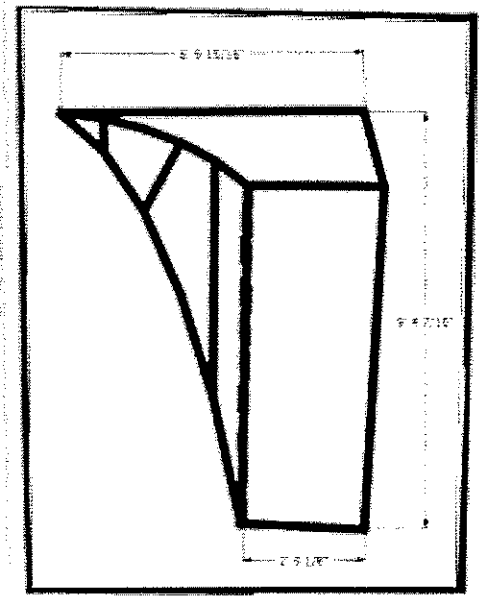
EARTHQUAKE LAUNCH



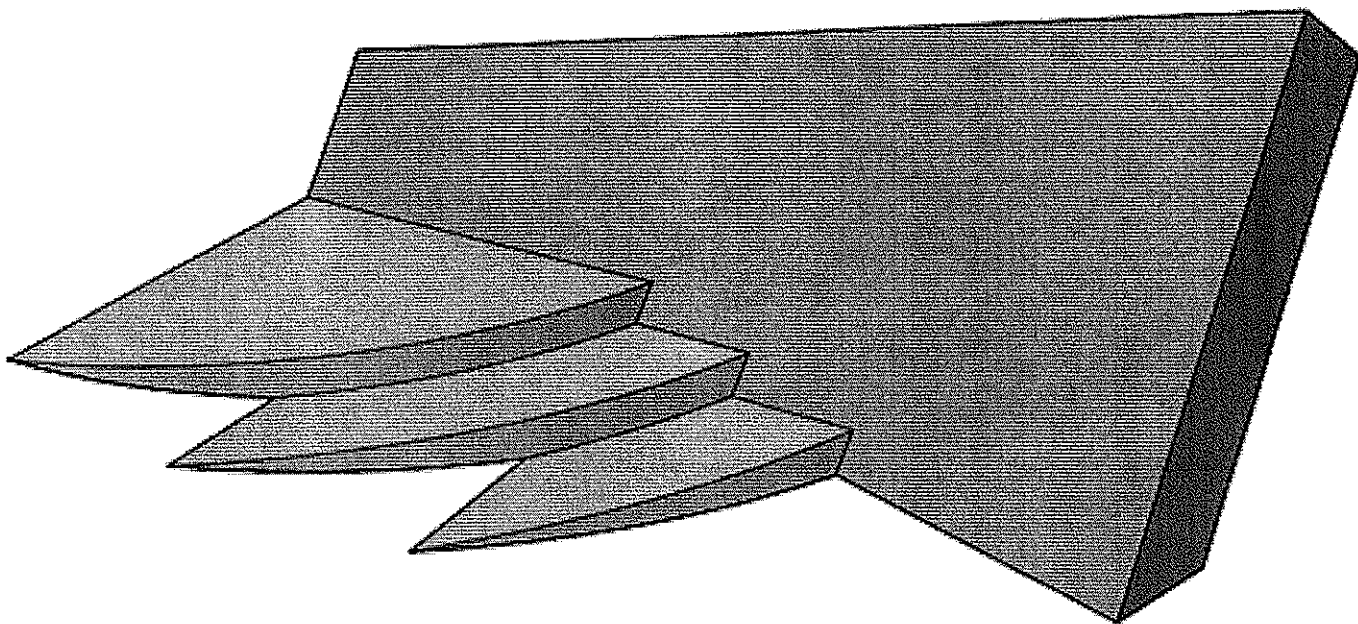
COMPLEX IN FORM AND FUNCTION

The EQ launch can be used as a wedge, quarter pipe, ledge and launch. Protected by steel edging and 6000 psi concrete. This piece will be well used by skaters and bikers. A great utility piece with a distinct look.

Tallest Point = 2' 6"



EARTHQUAKE STAIR WALL

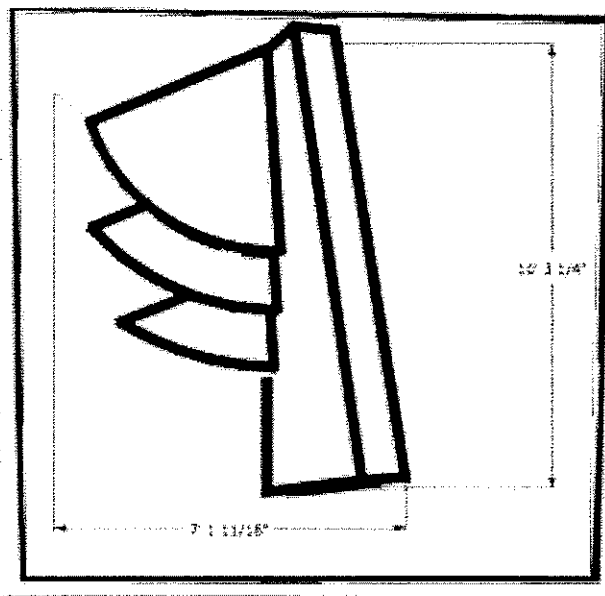


STAIRWAY TO SHREDDING

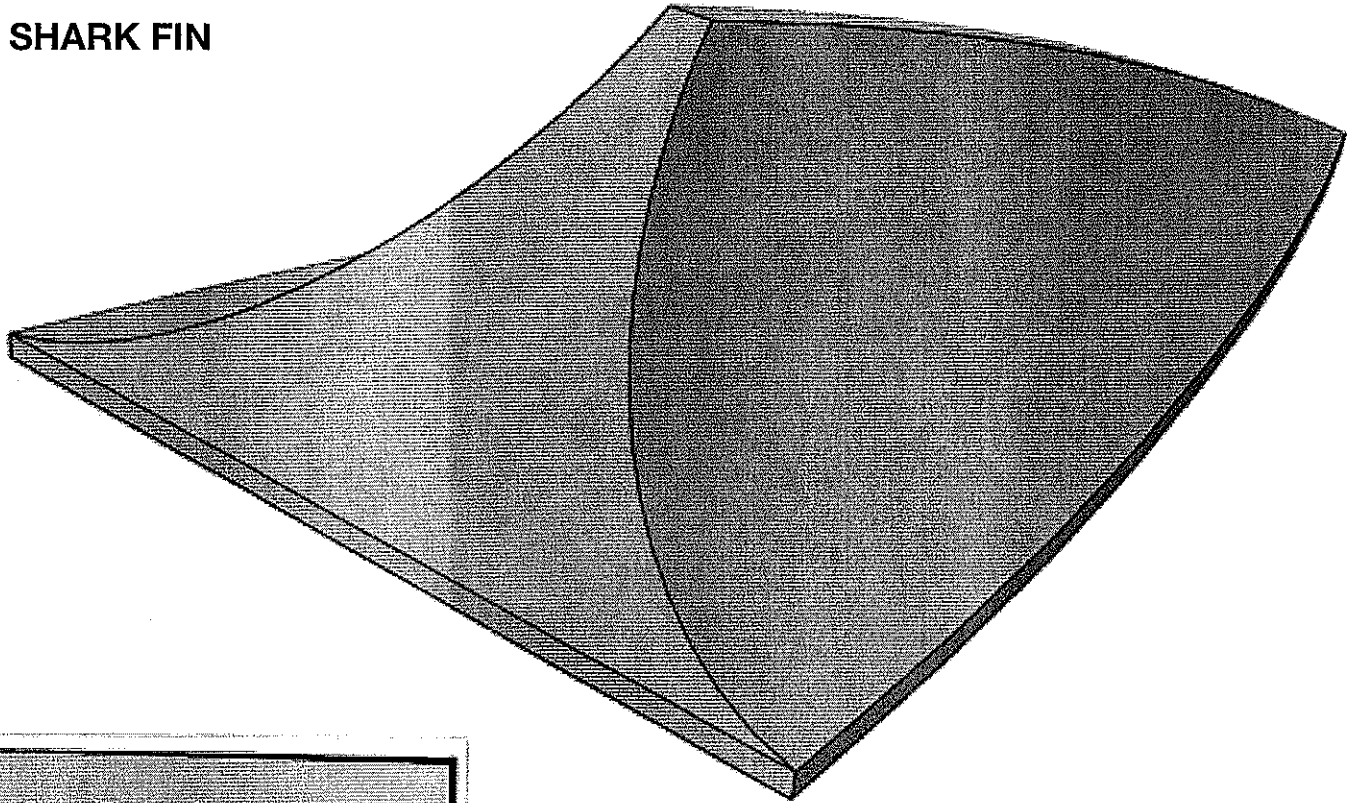
One of the most exciting pieces of our initial collection, the EQ Stair Wall gives skaters stairs to jump over and a ledge to grind. The slanted wall also serves as a wall ride.

Enhanced with brick texture and a granite top, this piece might look too good to skate.

Tallest Point = 4' 5"



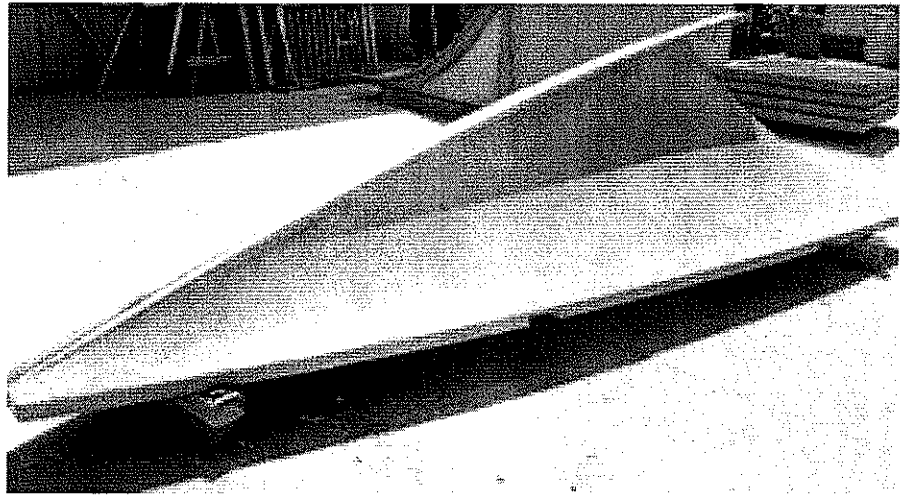
SHARK FIN



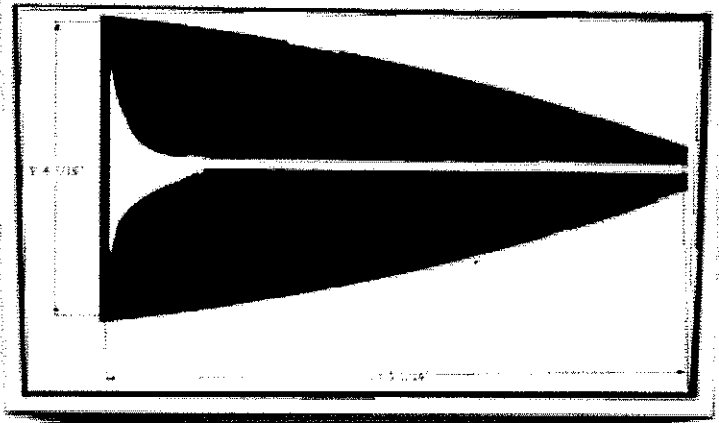
The Shark Fin is a fin-shaped concrete feature inspired by the sleek curves of the fins found on sharks.

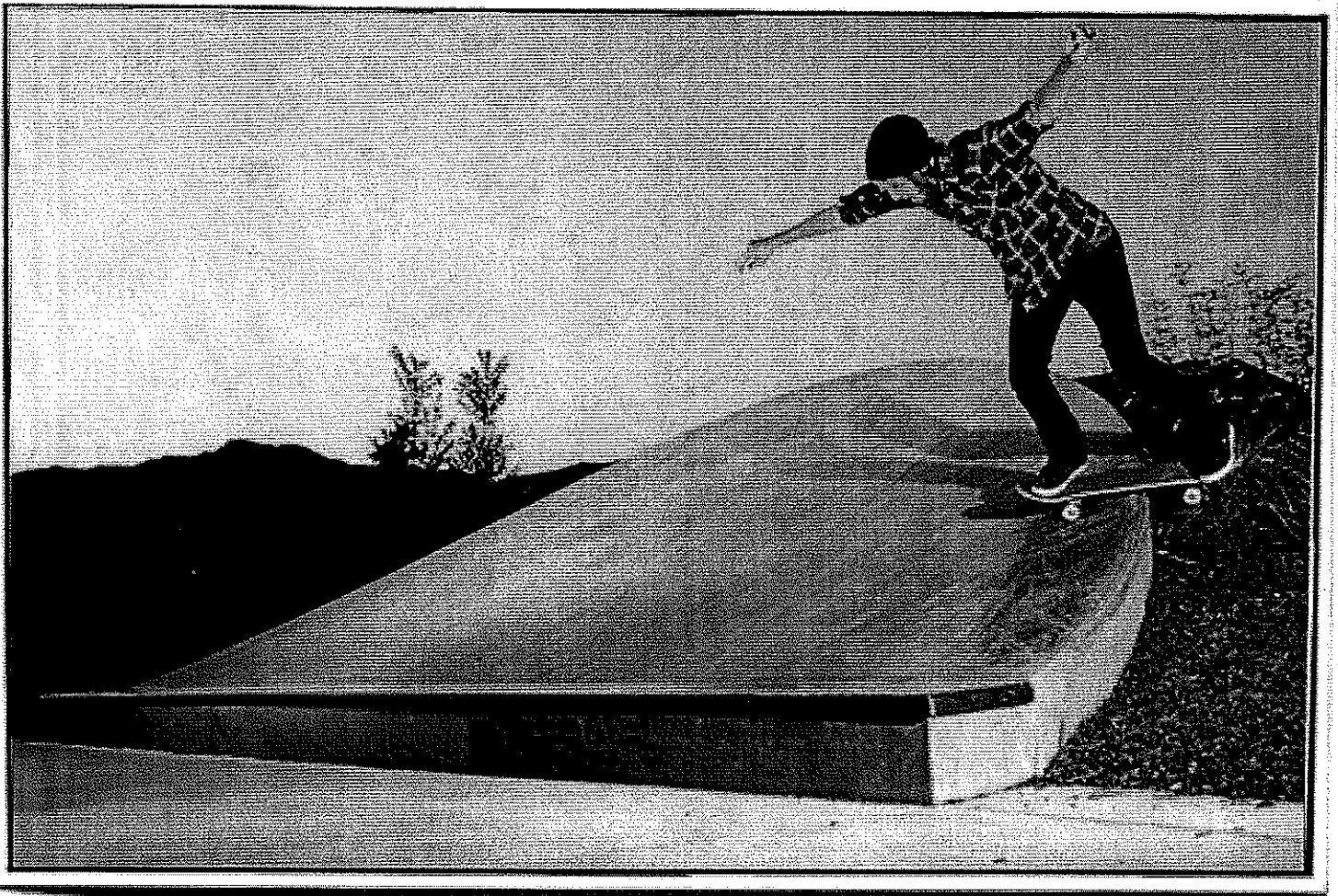
Combining transitions with a spike feature, the Shark Fin allows skaters to attack the obstacle from a variety of different angles. More creative skaters can use this piece as a launch ramp or as a ledge that allows you to grind up the face and roll away into transition.

Just as a Shark uses its fins to glide, turn, accelerate and roll in the ocean, skaters move their bodies in a similar fluid fashion.
