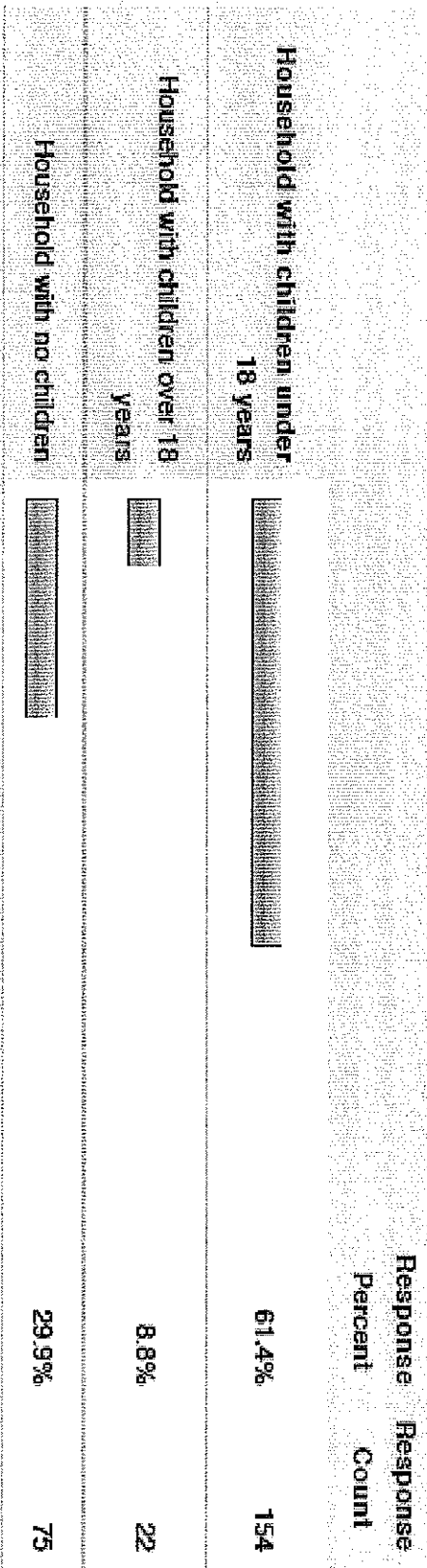

The purpose of this practice is to respond to questions from City Council members as necessary. When addressing the City Council, it is important to speak as a member of the Commission as a whole, rather than as an individual member. Should you be communicating your individual viewpoint on an issue, it is imperative that you first state that for the record. At all times Commissioners in the minority on an issue shall respect the decision and authority of the majority.

If the Commission has not discussed an item in advance of a City Council meeting, that must be stated when representing the Commission.

DISCUSSION

Please review the proposed representative list. Please bring any known conflicts to the Chairperson's attention during the discussion.

Following approval of the schedule, when Commissioner is unable to attend a scheduled Council meeting, seek a substitute Commissioner and inform the staff.
