### Civic Center Master Plan Update

Since the Parks & Recreation Commission's last meeting in June, a focus group was held on June 26. During this meeting, participants explored site planning opportunities for the new Community Center including an overall look at the long-range plan for Civic Center site. # **AB 1234 Training for Local Agency Officials**

What: MANDATORY AB 1234 (ETHICS) TRAINING

Why: AB 1234 requires local agency officials to receive two hours of training in local

government ethics every two years.

Who: All Members of County of Santa Clara Brown Act Bodies (e.g., Boards,

Commissions, and Committees) ("local agency official") are required to attend such training. In addition, any newly elected or appointed local agency official must receive the training within one year of assuming office and once every two

years thereafter.
