




#### Trends in Recreation Facilities YMCA

- 3) Teen programs (up from No. 4)
- 4) Adult sports teams (down from No. 3)
- 5) Individual sports activities like swim clubs or running clubs (up from No. 8)
- 6) Environmental education (did not appear in 2015)
- 7) Arts and crafts (did not appear in 2015)
- 8) Educational programs (did not appear in 2015)
- 9) Nutrition and diet counseling (down from No. 1)
- 10) Active older adult programs (did not appear in 2015)
