Prevention

Modern crime prevention is accomplished through awareness and opportunity reduction. Elements of a crime include; Desire, Ability & Opportunity.

Take care of your residence by eliminating the opportunity for crime as much as possible:

- Always lock doors and windows in your home and vehicle
- ◊ If you have an alarm system, use it
- Do not leave valuables unattended
- Watch for and promptly report suspicious activity around your home and neighborhood
- Install exterior lights to illuminate potential points-of-entry a burglar might target
- Trim bushes, trees and shrubs near points-of-entry, which could provide concealment to a burglar attempting to break in

- Place anti-burglary stickers such as Neighborhood Watch on your windows or doors
- BEWARE OF DOG signs can be very effective at deterring would-be burglars, even if you do not have a dog
