SUBJECT: Project Los Altos: SFMOMA in Silicon Valley

RECOMMENDATION:

Discuss activities related to Project Los Altos: SFMOMA in Silicon Valley

BACKGROUND

The San Francisco Museum of Modern Art (SFMOMA) exhibit Project Los Altos: SFMOMA in Silicon Valley will be in Los Altos from November 9, 2013 to March 2, 2014. City staff and Public Arts Commission (PAC) members are working with SFMOMA staff on the project.

DISCUSSION

At its July 25, 2013, August 22, 2013 and September 26, 2013 meetings, the PAC reviewed and discussed a brochure for the City's Public Sculpture program that is being developed to compliment the efforts of SFMOMA. City staff and PAC members have met with various staff from SFMOMA regarding educational opportunities and programming. Efforts are underway to involve the local schools and libraries in the project. Also, Commissioners are working with members of the History Museum on an exhibit featuring local artists during the exhibit. That exhibit will open on November 2, 2013 in the History Museum. As the time for the exhibit draws closer, it is anticipated that PAC will have an ever increasing role in various aspects of the project.

DISCUSSION

As of October 24, 2013, all of the sculptures recommended for installation have been installed. The *Guardian* was installed on September 27, 2013 and *By the Sea* was installed on October 14, 2013. This brings the total of sculptures in the City's Public Sculpture Program to 30.

Staff is also continuing to explore options for repairs to *Musical Gambol*, which is located in Lincoln Park. The base of the sculpture has fallen into disrepair with large sections of rust visible.
