SUBJECT: 2014/15 Commission Work Plan

RECOMMENDATION:

Formulate the 2014/15 Public Arts Commission Work Plan

BACKGROUND

Each year the Public Arts Commission (PAC) develops goals and priorities for the coming 12 months. These goals and priorities are drawn together in the Commission Work Plan to guide and direct the work of the Commission.

DISCUSSION

On March 4, 2014, the PAC met jointly with the City Council to discuss, among other items, the 2014/15 PAC Work Plan. Several potential work plan items were discussed at that time including: items related to developing an Arts Master Plan, consideration of placement of skateable art elements, and review of wayfinding signs. On March 17, 2014, a subcommittee of Commissioners Chapman, McBirney and Rini met with staff to discuss potential steps for the development of an Arts Master Plan. Certain items that arose from that meeting have been included in the draft work plan. At its March 27, 2014 meeting, the PAC reviewed the draft work plan and made further refinements.

The draft 2014/15 PAC Work Plan will be presented to the City Council at the joint Council/Commissions meeting to be held on April 29, 2014 and will be approved by the Council.
