RECOMMENDATION: Review submissions and determine next steps in selection process

BACKGROUND

The Public Arts Commission (PAC) recently conducted a call for submissions of artworks. Submissions were due to the City on January 15, 2019. The deadline was subsequently extended to March 12, 2019.

DISCUSSION

The City originally received submissions from 29 artists for approximately 40 pieces to be considered by the PAC. At the January 24, 2019 meeting, the PAC reviewed entries and determined to extend the submission deadline to March 12, 2019. The City subsequently received an additional 20 pieces submitted by 14 artists. At its April 4, 2019 and May 9, 2019 meetings, the PAC reviewed entries.

At the May 23, 2019 PAC meeting, the Commission voted to install three sculptures in various locations around the City.

DISCUSSION

On July 10, 2018, the PAC received a presentation from a subcommittee of commissioners regarding the current conditions of the sculptures then on display in the City. Five sculptures owned by the City were identified as in most need of maintenance. These pieces were cleaned and routine maintenance performed. It is recommended the PAC begin developing a maintenance schedule for the City-owned public art. A draft plan should be reviewed by the City's Maintenance staff prior to finalization.
