- To improve walking conditions and safety along El Monte Avenue for pedestrians accessing Almond Elementary School
- Safe Routes to School improvements are identified as City Council priority

Project Elements

- Five (5) feet wide Decomposed Granite (DG) walkway with wooden header on the west side
- Curb ramp improvements to comply with ADA requirements
- New crossings across El Monte
- Pedestrian activated Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB)


Project Elements (contd.)

- Revamped raised crosswalk at Clark
- Storm drain improvements

Outreach Efforts

- February 22, 2017 Bicycle/Pedestrian Advisory Commission (now Complete Streets Commission)
 - -35% design was presented
- September 26, 2018 Public Open House

February 22, 2017 Meeting



- Staff presented 35% Design
- Identified locations with parking impacts
- Parking eliminated between Higgins and Almond
- Net reduction in 8 parking spaces

- Consider adding an additional crosswalk at Mills Lane







Current Design


- Project elements are same as presented at February 22, 2017 meeting
- Refined design to incorporate feedback received at the previous meeting




Typical Cross-sections
